■ HOLISTIC & ANTI-AGING TREATMENTS

Thailand has treatments to suit everyone's preferences and needs, from the ancient to the modern, as well as from the traditional to the alternative.

Holistic health is concerned with integrating all aspects of one's life into a healthy whole. For example, rather than prescribing a bag of pills, a holistic practitioner will meet and discuss all the different elements of a person's life before making any recommendations. These recommendations often focus on the integration of a person's lifestyle, diet, fitness and stress management procedures.

Typically, they will try to induce the person's body to heal itself, rather than resorting to the 'modern' practice of pharmaceutical treatments. Often, recommendations are made to detoxify and cleanse the body

through diet, exercise, healthy habits, natural nutritional supplements, and in the beginning, perhaps colonics or hydrotherapy to rid the body of its accumulated toxins.

Since they play a key role in one's general well-being, holistic medicine goes even further by bringing emotions into the picture as having an influence on one's physical well-being; recognizing that everything is connected and interrelated.

Treatments might include yoga, meditation, dance and music therapy, or other calming therapies such as walking therapy and

mindfulness. Many health resorts and wellness retreats, in addition to private consultants throughout Thailand, can be found practicing holistic medicine and therapy.

Among the newer and rapidly increasing facilities in Thailand are those offering 'antiaging' or 'longevity' treatments. These centers perform thorough assessments of an individual's body, including complete blood counts, blood chemistry, urinalysis, as well as micronutrient level analysis. In some places, heavy metal toxicity, as well as hormone and inflammatory panels are assessed.

You might also receive total fitness and body composition assessments in addition to detailed cardiac function testing. More specialized facilities offer genomic assessments nowadays, along with extremely sophisticated lab tests. This ensures doctors and specialists can present a deeply personalized analysis offering a new approach to living a longer, healthier life.

Post-evaluation treatments will often include a special dietary regime and exercise program, nutritional supplements and bio-identical hormones, as well as skincare products and other lifestyle prescriptions.

One of the more famous holistic and anti-aging clinics in Thailand is Add-Life Anti-Aging Center, where American Board Certified doctors in Anti-aging and Regenerative Medicine use modern, state-of-the-art equipment and technology to analyze one's condition to treat age-related decline.

■ TRADITIONAL THAI MASSAGE

'Thai massage' is world famous, and a brand unto itself, famous for its healing properties. So where better to get a Thai massage and learn how to give one than in Thailand?

Traditional Thai massage involves extensive stretching and deep tissue massage, performed on a mat on the floor. Therefore, traditional attire in massage centers is Indian medicine practices. comfortable, loose-fitting clothing. The massage is performed by applying firm, steady, rhythmic pressure to the body, using hands and sometimes elbows and knees.

Normally, no oils are applied. The massage traces the body's natural energy lines, as described in both traditional Chinese and

The general idea is to move energy along meridians through the patient's body in a manner consistent with the patient's

breathing. After a massage, one often feels totally relaxed and invigorated, with a balanced body back in its natural harmony.

Wat Pho in Bangkok is world renowned for both teaching and providing massage services - known as the Traditional Medical and Massage School - as well as Wat Phra

Chetuphon, known to foreigners as the Temple of the Reclining Buddha. Wat Pho has been teaching massage for over 40 years, is the first massage school in Thailand, and is certainly its most famous.

More and more foreigners have been coming in recent years to not just receive Thai massages but to learn the art of giving them. The basic 30-hour course teaches a traditional yet simple type of massage that is good for relieving fatigue, restoring energy, and alleviating muscle cramps, stress, and nervous tension. It also makes the patient's body more supple while stimulating the blood and lymph glands, aiding one's overall physical fitness, and having positive effects on the 'giver's' body as well.

Another center of increasing fame in the Kingdom dedicated to preserving traditional Thai massage is Phothalai, set in a serene 16-acre complex where relaxation and tranquillity are the order of the day. For anyone interested in learning, or experiencing, traditional Thai massage, you are well advised to visit either of these special places.





1 | SAMITIVEJ HOSPITAL: CLINICAL 2 CARE PROGRAM CERTIFICATION (CCPC) FOR ACUTE MYOCARDIAL INFARCTION

With a team of doctors, nurses and a Coronary Angiography room ready 24 hours a day, Samitivei Hospital's Heart Centre can provide emergency assistance to patients within 90 minutes of their arrival to the hospital. The centre also offers rehabilitation and nutrition therapy, using advanced medical technology as a preventive measure.

BANGKOK HOSPITAL: CLINICAL CARE PROGRAM CERTIFICATION (CCPC) FOR ACUTE CORONARY SYNDROME

Usually associated with coronary thrombosis, Acute Coronary Syndrome is recognizable by a set of signs which can bring upon a sudden and unexpected reduced flow of blood to the heart. It can be effectively treated if diagnosed promptly. Treatments vary depending on the different symptoms and/or health conditions. Acute Coronary Syndrome is an emergency which can lead to death within a few hours. Therefore, immediate medical attention is essential.

BUMRUNGRAD HOSPITAL: CLINICAL CARE PROGRAM CERTIFICATION (CCPC) FOR ACUTE MYOCARDIAL INFARCTION WITH ST SEGMENT ELEVATION

Acute myocardial infarction (AMI), or as it is commonly known, a heart attack, is the disruption of the blood supply to the heart causing heart cells to die. This is an irreversible necrosis of the heart muscle resulting from an imbalance of oxygen supply and demand. Acute myocardial infarction is part of the field of acute coronary syndromes, which includes unstable angina. This restriction of the blood supply alongside a shortage of oxygen can cause death or damage to the heart if not treated immediately. Heart attacks are divided into two types depending on their severity:

- · AMI, or heart attack, the leading cause of death of men and women worldwide.
- STEMI, meaning ST segment elevation myocardial infarction, a more severe heart attack where the coronary artery is totally blocked off by a blood clot and nearly all the heart muscle starts to die.

PRIMARY STROKE

A primary stroke program is a collaboration of experts in their fields to arrange the earliest stroke program, potential stroke patients will gain knowledge on how to combat the possible onset of a stroke.

treatment is of the utmost importance. Early treatment can mean survival of the patient, as well as the minimization of brain damage. During a stroke, the blood supply to the brain is cut off, depriving the brain tissue of oxygen and nutrients. This means, that within just a few **program:** minutes, the brain cells start to die. A stroke is associated with high blood pressure, high cholesterol and cigarette smoking.

A Primary Stroke Fast Track system in leading hospitals calls for the availability of a

neurosurgeon to diagnose patients suffering from a stroke within 45 minutes of their arrival possible rehabilitation for patients. With a at the hospital. Samitivej Sukhumvit Hospital has received Clinical Care Program Certification (CCPC) for Osteoarthritis of the Knee.

Patients receive diagnosis, treatment, follow-up care and evaluation of their therapy in a systematic procedure. Treatment can be done either through medication, physiotherapy or surgery using the latest medical technology to reduce pain and complications, slowing down the degeneration of the knee joints to prevent any disability. Patients and caretakers will also be given advice on self-care by a team of specialists so that patients can resume their normal routines and activities.





LOW BACK PAIN

Samitivej Srinakarin Hospital has received Clinical Care Program Certification (CCPC) for Low Back Pain.

Samitivej Srinakarin Hospital's Orthopedic and Spinal Centre is the first hospital in Asia to be awarded the JCI CCPC certification for Low Back Pain. The hospital provides comprehensive medical treatment, on par with international standards, to patients suffering from pain in their back, bones and joints.

Their specialized system and process for diagnosing patients helps determine those who require surgery and treatment by a highly skilled and experienced expert team of orthopedic surgeons. Patients can be assured that they are receiving personalized care from their physicians as well as from rehabilitation and physical therapists, in order that they can return to their normal routine as soon as possible.

The Orthopedic and Spinal Centre at Samitivej Srinakarin Hospital has invested over THB 10,000,000 in renovations and medical equipment to provide comprehensive surgical facilities that are convenient as well as comfortable.

Bangkok Hospital has received Clinical Care Program Certification (CCPC) for their Breast Cancer Conserving Therapy Program.

Breast-conserving therapy, more commonly known as BCT, is an important appropriate surgery to treat early-stage breast cancer. This medical procedure consists of surgical excision of the breast cancer, which if small enough, leaves intact enough actual breast

to still allow an acceptable and comfortable appearance. Some healthy surrounding tissue may also have to be removed. It is normal on conclusion of breast-conserving therapy that the patient undergoes radiation treatment.

Successful treatment of breast cancer depends on early diagnosis, with a mammography playing a major role in the early detection of breast cancers. Reports show that a mammography can find 85 to 90 percent of

breast cancers in women over 50, discovering a lump up to two years before it can be felt. If a lump is discovered, a mammography can be a key tool in evaluating whether the lump is cancerous (malignant) or benign. If a breast abnormality is found or confirmed by a mammography, additional breast imaging tests such as ultrasound (sonography) or a breast biopsy should be performed.

LUNG CANCER



Samitivej Sukhumvit Hospital has received Clinical Care Program Certification (CCPC) for lung cancer.

Samitivej Hospital provides lung cancer patients with a comprehensive care and treatment program, especially in the screening of the disease among those who are in the high risk group. It emphasizes early detection and treatment through Autofluorescence Technology (AF) which can effectively treat cancer. If the cancer has spread throughout the body, diagnosis can be given through Endobronchial Ultrasound-guided Transbronchial Needle Aspiration (EBUS-TBNA) without any incision in the chest area, thereby, reducing any possible risks. Patients recover quickly and are able to resume their previous normal routine and activities.







TRANSPORTATION

Bangkok is the major transportation hub of Southeast Asia, with the new Suvarnabhumi International Airport at its core. One can fly directly to Bangkok from around the world. The city is a huge, sprawling metropolis. It is intimidating at first, but after a few days, one quickly learns the main routes, arteries, and transport systems, making getting to where you want to go a lot easier.

It is easier to get around with countless taxis, the BTS Skytrain and Underground MRT Subway (Metro). There are also the waterways, which many new tourists overlook; take a river taxi early on and you'll probably be using them more often.

There may be traffic jams, but nowadays, one can move quickly over or under them using excellent mass transit systems. It is worth taking a map or guidebook with you when traveling around the city, as it is such a huge, sprawling area. Pick out a few places you'd like to see, and have an adventure going there; the trick is not to visit more than a couple places at a time. One often starts overly ambitious but then quickly adjusts to the tropical heat, and slower paced lifestyle.

ATTRACTIONS

As far as attractions go, the Grand Palace, Wat Arun (Temple of Dawn), and the Wat



Phra Kaew (Temple of the Emerald Buddha), are must–sees. You might enjoy a dinner cruise along the Chao Phraya River, shopping at the massive Chatuchak Weekend Market, or even shopping for major, brand name items at Siam Paragon. There are numerous other places of interest worth consideration: Ananta Samakhom Throne Hall, Suan Pakkad Palace, the Joe Louis Puppet Show, Siam Niramit, Jim Thompson Museum and the nearby Damnoen Saduak Floating Market and Amphawa Market.

ACTIVITIES

You can probably find whatever it is you'd like to do in the great city of Bangkok. Some

suggestions might include getting a Thai massage, attending a Thai Cooking School, seeing some Muay Thai boxing, going golfing or simply sightseeing around the city.

An appealing way to get the lay of the land, and a feel for Bangkok is to cruise around on the Skytrain, enjoying the elevated view in cool comfort. You might disembark at Saphan Taksin by the river and take a river taxi upriver past the Temple of the Dawn to the Grand Palace, then later retrace your route, or simply travel until you see an area you like, get off, and look around. Bangkok is unusually safe for a city of its size, with taxis everywhere in case you get lost.







SHOPPING

It is no exaggeration to say that Bangkok is one of the world's great shopping destinations, where you can shop all day, every day, for months. There are luxury shopping malls such as Siam Paragon and Gaysorn Plaza; multi-story electronic plazas, such as Panthip Plaza; massive markets such as the overwhelming Chatuchak Weekend Market; and a gaggle of local markets that sell everything from trinkets and knick-knacks to fresh fish and flowers. Many visitors enjoy the Pratunam and Chinatown districts of Bangkok, the former for wholesale clothing, and the latter for gold, jewelry, and a mish-mash of other items.


ATTRACTIONS



TRANSPORTATION

Samui is not difficult to get to, whether by land, sea, or air. Many ferries make their rounds daily between Surat Thani and Chumporn on the mainland, to the islands of Koh Samui, Koh Pha Ngan and Koh Tao. Koh Samui International Airport on the island is served mostly by Bangkok Airways, with a daily Thai Airways flight. There are also an airport and train station in Surat Thani, where people can arrive and then make their way to nearby ferries. Once on Koh Samui, travelers may access the usual selection of Thai transport vehicles, including cars, motorcycles, bicycles, taxis and songthaews (converted pick–ups).

ATTRACTIONS

There are many curious and interesting attractions on Koh Samui. Some of the most popular are Ang Thong Marine National Park, Wat Phra Yai (Big Buddha Temple), Secret Buddha Garden, Grandmother & Grandfather Rocks, Hin Lat Waterfall, the Snake Farm, Naga Pearl Farm, Samui Aquarium and Tiger Zoo and the Butterfly Garden & Insect Museum. 




ATTRACTIONS

TRANSPORTATION

Koh Chang is located about 190 miles (315 km) southeast of Bangkok near the Cambodian border in Trat province. One can drive to Trat, or take an air–conditioned bus there. Bangkok Airways is the only carrier flying into Trat, where you can catch one of the regular ferries to Koh Chang. Once on the island, there are songthaews and taxis. Motorcycles and bicycles are available for rent to explore the island.

ATTRACTIONS

There are some great waterfalls on the eastern coast of Koh Chang. Mu Koh Chang National Park, which comprises parts of Koh Chang and other islands, can be easily reached by boat on a nice day trip. Koh Chang's waterfalls – once frequented by previous kings of Thailand – are favorites of hikers, trekkers and wildlife and bird watchers. The most popular waterfalls are Klong Plu Waterfall and Thanmayom Waterfall. You can also visit Bang Bao Fishing Village and the nearby islands of Koh Ngam, Koh Chang Noi, Koh Wai, Koh Rang and Koh Kood.

ACTIVITIES

The great attraction of Koh Chang is Mother Nature herself, and people who love nature love Koh Chang. The beaches are lovely and well preserved, and the mountainous interior of the island makes for great exploratory adventures. There is also elephant trekking, which includes options to feed and bathe the gentle elephants in a waterfall.

Thai Cooking classes are another popular option in many resorts on the island. Other interesting and worthwhile activities include kayaking, canoeing and firefly viewing as well as a visit to an elephant camp or fishing village.

Many tour operators on the island offer snorkeling and diving tours as the diving is highly rated with visibility up to 65 meters on a calm day. If you feel more adventurous, you can try Tree Top Adventure Park, where you can move through an assortment of contraptions such as rope bridges, Tarzan swings, flying skateboards, tightrope walking and sailing down giant zip lines. In the end, one leaves Koh Chang feeling renewed, refreshed and invigorated.



SHOPPING

Although shopping isn't the main event on Koh Chang, there are souvenir shops selling handicrafts, t–shirts, tailored clothing and sarongs.

Some beaches have a few boutique shops, and many vendors sell goods along the beach.

Shopping areas in Koh Chang include White Sand Beach, Klong Prao Beach (three villages – each with its own shopping plaza), Kai Bea Beach and Lonely Beach.

TRANSPORTATION

Chiang Rai is somewhat off the beaten path, which is why it is so beautiful and peaceful. However, it is not that difficult at all to get there – by plane, bus, car or even motorcycle, which is a gorgeous ride through the mountains. Thai Airways as well as Thai AirAsia have daily flights between Bangkok and Chiang Rai. Once there, there are a number of car or motorcycle rental companies, or given Chiang Rai's size, you might even rent a bicycle for the duration of your stay.

ATTRACTIONS

Before Chiang Mai's ascendance, Chiang Rai was the capital of the expansive Lanna – or "millions of ricefields" – Kingdom. Thus, there are remnants of her greatness throughout the area in the form of ancient temples and city walls. Chiang Rai was once a crossroads of the north due to its location near the infamous Golden Triangle, where Thailand meets Laos and Burma. Formerly, this was a wild, lawless land of drug warlords and opium routes. Now, it is home to an extraordinary Opium Museum, and through the Royal Project's drug









eradication programs, the farmers are now growing tea, coffee, strawberries and other crops instead of opium. It remains a scenic and fascinating area to sightsee.

There are a number of wonderful sites to visit in the area, beautiful gardens and plantations, ethnic villages and winding border roads. Some of the sites you may wish to see include the Golden Triangle, Kok River, Mae Sai, Doi Tung, Mae Fah Luang Botanical Gardens, Doi Mae Salong, Phu Chi Fa, Chiang Rai Hilltribe Museum, Chiang Saen National Museum, Wat Phra Sing, Wat Phra That Chedi Luang and Wat Rong Khun – the White Temple. One should also consider visiting the hill tribe villages of the Yao, Karen, Lisu, Hmong, Lahu and Akha.

ACTIVITIES

Given its location and environment, most of the activities in Chiang Rai are natural and out of doors. It is a great place for trekking, taking boat rides, river rafting, elephant riding and cycling. Golfers will find a few nice courses in the area, and there is a small zoo and animal park for the children.





SHOPPING

Many of the mountain villages in the Chiang Rai area produce handicrafts or ethnic jewelry for sale. You will find small, intriguing markets along the winding roads to Doi Mae Salong, which has one of the most amazingly diverse morning markets in the country. Here, mountain peoples in their traditional dress, participate in ethnic Chinese trading often with Westerners ogling strange concoctions with scorpions or snakes in jars of "medicine". Travelers will find more traditional, typical markets in Chiang Rai city including the Night Bazaar. It is the inspiration for Chiang Mai's world–famous night bazaar. Be sure you visit just after the sun sets. In addition to shops and stalls, there are a few places in the area selling Western food.

Mae Sai, the border crossing to Burma, is about 36 miles (60 kms) north of Chiang Rai. It is a fascinating border town with a wide range of items for sale, from dried fruit to DVD's to gems. You can also get a pass to cross into Tachilek, on the Burmese side. Visitors can find a selection of gems, especially jade for sale in Mae Sai. The jade workshops are open for visits and are interesting to see. Some items for purchase are not exportable to many Western countries. Shoppers should be mindful and may elect to consult a travel guide or their home destination's policies.

Add to this a country that is easy to fly to from anywhere in the world, and one that has the Thus, you can appreciate its attractiveness as a medical tourism destination. Furthermore, with almost unbelievable cost savings, your decision to go to Thailand starts becoming very easy indeed.

Of course there are a number of topics vou'll need to look into before making the best tourism infrastructure in the region by far. final decision, as you would before going anywhere for serious medical treatment. Some of these issues are general, while others are more Thailand-specific.

The key to success is adequate research and thorough preparation. Make all your plans, choices and decisions before you leave home.

We've prepared this guide to make this process as easy and straightforward for you as possible. We suggest reading through it first, and then selecting the items relevant to you for further exploration. Doing so will give you the peace of mind you'll need to begin your journey through this important healing adventure.

Alternatively, if for whatever reasons recovery time needed, and it would be hard to you prefer to have someone else handle everything for you, please see our section at the end of this chapter on using medical tourism agents or companies. There are many reasons you might prefer to have this handled professionally for you step by step, and a proper agent will do exactly what is needed to guide you through the process.

If it's possible for your partner, spouse, friend or a relative to join you on your trip to Thailand, all the better. Obviously, there will be times when you're not functioning at your best, and someone from home will be a great to be done.

1 | DO YOUR RESEARCH

Do your homework. Step 1 involves gathering as much information as possible, then organizing and evaluating it. Make sure to discuss it and consider everything, before making a decision to proceed or not.

Get as much information and documentation as possible from your current doctor. Read all the information and discuss your options with your doctor and other specialists, if possible.

Consider all the treatment options and alternatives as well as potential complications and the typical length of the recovery process.

Once you know all this, you'll be in a good position to proceed to the next step.

2 | MAKE THE DECISION TO PROCEED

Now that you've done your research and know all your options, you're ready to make the decision to proceed and look more seriously into seeking medical care in Thailand. There will be numerous steps in this process, but you will learn something important in each one and gradually, you'll have chosen a hospital and a doctor as well as begun to make your travel plans.

Ideally, you will discuss your various selections with someone you trust and seek testimonials from others who have already done what you are now planning. One day, you may be the one in a position to advise others, but now you must start looking for the best hospital or clinic and doctor to handle your specific case.

3 | MAKE A SHORT LIST OF **DOCTORS AND TREATMENT FACILITIES**

This is obviously the most important decision you'll be making, so take your time, look into all the options, evaluate each one, ask questions and then make a decision.

You'll certainly want a facility and a doctor that make you feel at ease and are not rushing or pressuring you into making a decision. Avoid the medical service providers and doctors who are impatient or impersonal; there are many others around who will provide you with the respect and patience you deserve.

Make a short list of two or three of the places that you have found best meet your criteria. Continue on with the next steps in your process, and eventually you'll narrow it down to the perfect place with the best doctor for vou. You should continue with this checklist until you feel comfortable making your decision.

Be sure to look into the doctor's background. qualifications and experience. If this information is not forthcoming, cross them off your list and move on to the next place, until you find one that answers all your questions thoroughly, makes you feel comfortable and offers assistance as vou need it.

Before making the big decision, check out the facilities as closely as possible; determine all the costs involved: confirm who your attending physician will be, and establish the time frame for not only your treatment but also for the recovery process. You'll need to know exactly how long you'll need to stay in Thailand after your treatment to avoid any complications that might occur - you don't want something happening to you that you need to deal with a few days after you return home.

If you're ever unsure about any of these issues, either push for more information or seek the help of a medical travel agency which has experience with the type of treatment you are seeking. You should be confident of every step of the process before finalizing your plans to undergo treatment in Thailand.

ESTABLISH INITIAL CONTACT WITH THE HOSPITALS OR CLINICS YOU'VE CHOSEN

Now that you've chosen some hospitals or clinics, contact them. Start with their website's email contact form; this will be a good first test of their responsiveness and professionalism.

Once you've made contact, ask them some of the basic questions you've prepared in advance: what is the treatment process for your condition at their facility; who will be doing the required procedure; what are their qualifications; what are the total costs, including pre- and postsurgery tests, medications, and service; how long do you need to be in Thailand; and what are the other terms and conditions?

Be sure to advise them of any complicating factors you may have that they will need to be aware of to give you an accurate estimate. For example, having certain allergies, being pregnant, having HIV or diabetes and other conditions could have an impact on the treatment, length of stay and costs.

5 | QUESTION THE DOCTOR AND HOSPITAL THOROUGHLY

Since your treatment is certainly a critical issue to you and your health, don't hesitate to guestion the treatment facility and doctor about anything you're unsure of. If you are not receiving the responses you need, you should look elsewhere. You'll need to ask tough questions such as your doctor's experience and qualifications, what complications might arise as a result of your procedure, what type of anesthesia will they be using and other questions. You need to feel comfortable with the facility and the doctor and confident to proceed, so this will be like a final screening process for you.

Here are some sample questions you might ask, depending on what type of treatment or surgery you will be having:

- What accreditations does your hospital or clinic have?
- What professional organizations do vou belong to?
- What qualifications do you hold, and where did you receive them?
- Are you certified with local, national and/or international health organizations?
- What is your experience in performing this type of procedure?
- How frequently and when did you last perform this type of procedure?
- What is your success rate for this
 What happens if something goes wrong procedure?
- What are the frequency and types of complications that you have had performing this type of procedure?

- How many international patients have received this procedure at your facility?
- Could you send me a list of references of those that have had this procedure done at your facility?
- Will I need to undergo anesthesia during this procedure? Please elaborate on details, including anesthesiologist, type of anesthesia to be used, etc.
- Where will the procedure actually take place?
- Do you have a crash cart in case of an emergency?
- and I need additional treatment or another operation? Who will cover these expenses?
- How long will I be hospitalized altogether?

- How much recovery time will I need? What can I do during this period?
- How soon after the procedure can I safely flv home?
- What happens if complications develop after I return home? How and who will deal with these complications?
- What kind of follow up procedures do you have for my procedure or operation?
- What is included in the price of the procedure?
- What is not included in the price of the procedure?

6 | SELECT A FACILITY AND A DOCTOR

Based on all your research and the answers to all your questions from your short list, you are now in a position to make the final decision as to which hospital or clinic and doctor you will use. Depending on the type of operation or procedure you need, there may still be time to change your mind on the ground in Thailand after physically examining the facilities and meeting your doctor. For more major operations that need advance scheduling and down payments, this is far less of an option.

7 | PREPARE | PRE-INFORMATION | MATERIALS

For many procedures or operations, the doctor will want to see as many materials as possible about your condition. You should have all your x-rays, photos, MRI's and other relevant information scanned, so that you will always have the originals.

Ask your home facility to assist you with this or recommend services where you can make copies of these important files. Your treatment facility or doctor in Thailand should request this information from you. If they don't, either ask them yourself or choose another hospital or clinic that does ask you for them.



8 | FINALIZE ALL INFORMATION AND COSTS

After these initial contacts and exchanges of information, you need to get a quote for all services and treatment required. The medical facility should be advising you thoroughly during this process about time as well as any pre-surgical requirements that you need to know such as not eating for a specific length of time and not taking aspirin for a certain number of days.

9 | MAKE AN APPOINTMENT

During the process above, you should have been advised regarding scheduling procedures. Depending on your medical condition and the treatments you are to receive, it is advisable to contact a hospital several weeks to several months in advance to ensure that you can receive treatment from the doctor you prefer when it is convenient for you to travel to Thailand to receive it.





10 | PLAN YOUR TRAVEL TO THAILAND

The actual planning of your trip can be a bit overwhelming, especially on top of all your medical planning. Thus, we have compiled this checklist for you.

- Make all your reservations and bookings for air travel, accommodation and any tour packages you might wish to take. Get hotel recommendations from your hospital, clinic or travel broker, making sure it is located near your treatment center. Take into account recovery time and doctor's recommendations regarding travel and any post-treatment activity.
- Figure how much time you'll be spending in Thailand. If it's more than 30 days, you should get a tourist visa from the Thai Embassy in your home country for 60 days. Please see our "Useful Information for Visitors to Thailand" section for further details.



- Make a travel packet of important documents, maps and information you'll need in Thailand. Leave one set of copies at home. Important documents you'll need include:
- Medical records: e.g., X-Rays, MRI's, health histories, photographs, immunization records, prescriptions and any other health records relevant to your surgery. Carry all these medical reports and any medicines in your carry-on luggage so there is no chance of them getting lost.
- Copies of your passport, air tickets, extra photographs and other essential medical paperwork.
- Emergency contacts, including names and numbers of relatives, friends, employer and your home physician.
- Map of the locations and telephone numbers of your home embassy in Thailand, the hospital where you will receive medical treatment and the hotel where you will be staying.
- Cash, credit cards, debit cards and travelers checks. Bring enough cash to cover all travel expenses, as well as unforeseen expenses. You can change your home currency into Thai Baht at the airport upon arrival or numerous banks and foreign exchange services in Thailand. You'll also be able to withdraw money at the many ATM's located around Thailand.
- Driver's license. Carry your driver's license and make sure it will remain valid throughout your trip and long beyond. Keep this in a prominent place along with your passport, as these will serve as important identification documents and be useful in case of emergencies.



11 | RECEIVE YOUR | PRE-OPERATIVE | ASSESSMENT

Depending on your operation or procedure, you will have a pre-operative assessment performed before your treatment. Be sure to schedule time for this and ask your treatment facility what will be involved.

12 | RECEIVE YOUR TREATMENT

At this point, you've done all that you can, and you are in the hands of your chosen doctor and treatment provider. You can now relax, remain calm and follow the instructions given to you in your medical facility.

13 WHAT TO DO AFTER TREATMENT?

This all depends on your procedure or operation. In most cases, you'll be spending at least some time in the hospital. Be sure to check this beforehand so you know what to expect and can plan accordingly.

At some point, you'll be released. Since chances are you'll need to come back for a check-up, you may have some time to take a tour, visit a spa perhaps or see some sights. You should have planned for this already if you've been following the checklist above. Take it easy and try to enjoy your medical holiday before your check-up and eventual departure.

Be sure to get as much information as possible before leaving Thailand, as communications will obviously be more difficult from abroad. You should know the answers to common questions such as:



- How much pain will I have, and how long will it last after my procedure?
- What are the possible complications of my procedure, and how common are they?
- How soon can I have visitors after my treatment?
- Will I need physical therapy, and if so, for how long?
- How long should I stay in Thailand before flying home?
- Will I need physical help getting around after my treatment? If so, for how long?
- How long should I wait before returning to work?
- What restrictions should I observe after my procedure, and for how long?
- What medications will I need, where are they available, and how long will I need to take them?
- Will there be follow-up options with my doctor from home, such as telephone calls, emails, or online chats?
- What should my home physician know? And what should I give my doctor in the form of files, x-rays, or documents?
- What about insurance paperwork? Will you assist me with this?





14 | FIGURE THE TOTAL COST OF YOUR MEDICAL HOLIDAY

Although the cost of your treatment will most certainly be less than at home, be sure to take into account all costs of your medical holiday when planning and budgeting for your trip. Don't forget to include the following:

- Passports, visas, and any supplementary paperwork
- International flights and extra (hidden) fees
- Immigration and emigration fees
- Transportation costs from your home to your hotel in Thailand and back
- Accommodation
- Food
- Communication costs: telephone, internet and phone cards
- Medical equipment, if needed (wheelchairs, crutches, bandages, etc.)
- Medication
- Travelers insurance
- Post-operative treatment and recovery
- Shopping, entertainment and recreation
- Tours
- Gifts
- Contingency funds

BE PREPARED TO STAY LONGER OR SHORTER THAN EXPECTED

You may not want to get air tickets with too many conditions, as your post-operative treatment may take more, or possibly less, time than projected. Do not make your schedule too tight and inflexible, as it's not unusual for changes to occur.

16 WORK WITH A MEDICAL **TOURISM COMPANY**

As we mentioned at the beginning of this chapter, you can arrange medical treatment yourself or you can use a medical tourism agent, of which there are now many available.

If you've been to Thailand before and feel things yourself. comfortable communicating with clinics or hospitals, you might want to consider arranging everything yourself. If you run into trouble, you can always seek professional assistance later.

If you have friends or relatives living in Thailand, you're probably better off having them assist you if they are willing to do so. They will certainly have your best interests at heart and be familiar with the Thai medical scene. They may be able need to pay a broker.

On the other hand, if you have never been to Thailand and don't know anyone living in the country, you may want to seek the help of professionals, especially if you're elderly, disabled or an inexperienced traveler. There are potential obstacles along the way, and if you are not in the best of health, you're well advised to let a medical tourism agency handle everything for you. If you choose carefully,

they may hardly cost anything extra, as they will receive their payments while handling your case and arranging all logistics.

The truth is that a professional medical tourism provider can take care of virtually everything for you, even the unexpected, which are worth looking into, even if you decide to handle

Among their services are providing you with detailed information about various procedures, detailed hospital and surgeon profiles, medical records transfer, free surgery guotes, pre-and post-consultation with the Thai hospital, feedback and testimonials from previous patients, medical and dental loan financing, passport and visa advice, airport pick-up and drop-off, travel insurance, to negotiate discounts for you, and you won't hotel booking, tourism services in country and more.

USEFUL INFORMATION FOR VISITORS TO THAILAND

Useful Information for Visitors to Thailand



PASSPORT & VISAS

Citizens of New Zealand, Australia, Canada, the USA, and most European nations may enter Thailand for up to 30 days without a Thai visa when arriving by air. Be sure to note that those entering Thailand by land, however, will receive a Thai visa waiver for only 15 days.

You may not require a visa for Thailand if you are citizen of one of the 40 or so nations that qualify for a Thai visa waiver or Thai visa exemption. Please visit www.mfa.go.th for more details and the latest information from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Visa application forms are also available here.

If your citizenship does not qualify you for a visa waiver, or if you are planning to stay in Thailand for longer than your visa waiver would allow (30 days at the airport normally), you'll need to apply for a Thai visa at an embassy or consulate outside of Thailand, normally in your home country. These will typically be for 60 days.

You can renew these tourist visas in countries bordering Thailand, typically Laos, Cambodia, or Malaysia. Three consecutive visas can be issued to you in this manner, after which you'll need to leave the Kingdom for 60 days before beginning the process anew.

CUSTOMS & IMMIGRATION

ON ARRIVAL AT THAILAND IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS

Before traveling to Thailand – or anywhere abroad – please be sure that your passport will not expire for at least 6 months. It is highly recommended that you always have at least 9 months validity on your passport, as one never knows if something unexpected might happen during your travels to cause delays, at which point you won't have to worry about your passport expiring.

DECLARATIONS AND ALLOWANCES

Duty Free: No import fees will be charged to anyone entering Thailand as long as the value of their personal items is not more than 80,000 Baht. Furthermore, goods you bring in need to be for personal or professional use, not subject to restriction or prohibition, and the overall amount is within reasonable limits.

In addition, you cannot bring more than 250 grams of cigars or smoking tobacco, or 200 cigarettes into Thailand, or more than 1 liter of wine or liquor.

Useful Information for Visitors to Thailand

Tourists can receive VAT refunds of 7% on items purchased at major stores. In order to qualify, however, one must spend at least 2,000 Baht per store each day, and the total must come to a minimum of 5.000 Baht.

MONEY MATTERS

BARGAINING

Bargaining is common throughout Thailand, the exception being in big department stores. In general, you can expect to bargain prices down roughly 20-40%.

You will fare much better if you do this in a spirit of fun and above all, in a calm, friendly manner. Thais will appreciate your negotiating skills if you do this properly. People may gather around to watch your bargaining skills as well, adding to the fun.

TIPPING

In the past, there was no tipping done in Thailand; people paid for what they wanted, and that was that. However, as tourism increased, and Westerners began arriving in larger numbers, many of them tipped, just as they would back home. Obviously, this is something one gets used to rather quickly, so tipping is now a much more common practice in Thailand, especially at larger tourist destinations.

At restaurants – not street stalls – it's become much more common to leave tips of about 10%. It's common to let taxi drivers keep the change within

reasonable limits. Tipping in hotels is a personal matter, and depends on the service offered: normally 20 Baht is adequate for porters, waiters, and parking attendants. Of course, the service staff in larger hotels expects a bit more, which in Thailand is only about 50 to 100 Baht, or 2-3 US dollars. Many hotels and large restaurants now add a 10% service charge to the bill automatically.

VAT REFUND

Tourists can receive VAT refunds of 7% on items purchased at major stores. In order to qualify, however, one must spend at least 2,000 Baht per store each day, and the total must come to a minimum of 5,000 Baht.

If you qualify, you must take your receipt. passport, and flight info to the VAT Refund counter at the store where you bought the items. You must do this on the same day as well. When you're at the airport leaving Thailand at the end of your trip, you will see a VAT Refund counter in the departures terminal before you pass through customs on your way to the departures. After you have completed the procedures, you must show these forms and the purchased items to the customs officials there.

BUSINESS HOURS

CLINICS AND HOSPITALS

All major hospitals have 24-hour emergency rooms for those with urgent matters. These hospitals normally have a walk-in service throughout the day, whereas private clinics' hours vary depending on the clinic. Often they will have morning and evening hours, and the physicians will work in hospitals during the day. Please check the clinic hours before BTS SKYTRAIN going to them.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Emergency services are available 24 hours/day in all of Thailand's big cities. Again, the larger cities will have better services, while smaller villages may only have a small clinic with a nurse. The emergency number is 191, and you should ask a Thai to call for you to ensure proper understanding and communication.

BANKING HOURS

Thai banks are open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Some branches are open longer hours and on weekends in malls. Currency exchange booths generally have longer hours every day for the convenience of tourists needing to exchange currency.

SHOPS AND DEPARTMENT STORES

Most malls and department stores are open from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 or 10:00 p.m. every day. Small convenience stores open early in the morning and stay open late, often until around midnight. There are also 7-11 stores everywhere in Thailand now, which basically never close.

The BTS skytrain runs daily from 6:00 a.m. to midnight. Service is very frequent and more trains operate during rush hours.

MRT SUBWAY

The MRT underground Blue Line begins service at 6:00 a.m. and shuts down at midnight daily. These trains run very frequently, arriving about 5 minutes apart during the morning and evening rush hours.

POST OFFICES

Thailand's post offices are open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and in some places, Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Many small branches are closed on weekends. All post offices are closed on public holidays.

MUSEUMS AND GALLERIES

Thailand's museums and art galleries are normally open to the public from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. daily. Times may vary from place to place, and some may close one day during the week and/or on public holidays. It is always best to check in advance before making plans to visit a museum or gallery.

NIGHTCLUBS / PUBS

Most night spots in the Kingdom are required to close by 1:00 a.m., while hotel bars and certain clubs in major tourist destinations may have special permits from the authorities to stay open until 2:00 - 3:00 a.m.

DOS & DON'TS OF THAI CULTURE

Thai culture is renowned for its openness, friendliness, and generosity. Thais are rightly proud of their country, their culture, and the Monarchy. Given their non-confrontational nature, you may not know in many cases that you are even doing something offensive. This is why it's important to learn what you can about Thai culture and customs in advance, and follow these basic rules:

- Above all, visitors should show respect for the King, the Queen and the Royal Family, as well as any images of royal family members. It is against the law to speak ill of the Royal family, and it is required to stand in honor of the King prior to movie screenings and other public events.
- One should dress neatly and respectfully in public, especially when visiting religious

sites. T-shirts, shorts, tank tops, and similar beach-type attire are not permitted, and you will not be allowed in to many temples in such garb. Shoes are always removed before entering temples or people's homes.

- All Buddha images are sacred, and should be treated as such. Do not climb upon them for photographs or otherwise defame them.
- Buddhist monks are forbidden to touch or be touched by a woman, as well as to accept anything from the hand of one. If a woman has to give anything to a monk, she should first give it to a man who can then offer it to the monk.
- Monks are likewise not allowed to sit next to women on public transportation, so women should be aware and respectful,

and not occupy an empty seat next to a monk, causing him to move.

- In general, Thais do not normally shake hands when greeting one another. Instead, they place their palms together in a prayerlike gesture called a wai. A younger person or person of lesser social status wais an elder or more senior person, who will then return the gesture. This is changing somewhat in business settings, where more Western etiquette is frequently observed.
- For Thai people, the head is the highest part of the body and the feet are the lowest,

both literally and figuratively. Therefore, avoid touching people on the head and do not point your feet at people whenever possible. Do not use your feet to point at objects, move things, or even close a door; it is considered very bad form to do so.

 Public displays of affection are frowned upon, as are visible displays of emotion, especially anger or rage. Thais respect patience and tranquility a great deal, and displaying calm behavior will be respected by Thais, as well as aid you in your interactions.



The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO), commonly known as The Joint Commission, is an independent, not-for-profit organization that evaluates and accredits more than 19,000 healthcare organizations in the United States.

JCAHO's Joint Commission International (JCI) was founded in 1997 to survey hospitals outside of the United States. JCI, which is not-for-profit, currently accredits facilities in Asia, Europe, the Middle East and South America, and has accredited more than 400 hospitals in 46 countries.

Through international accreditation, consultation, publications and education programs, JCI extends

The Joint Commission's objectives worldwide by working to improve the quality of patient care by assisting international health care organizations, public health agencies, health ministries and others evaluate, improve and demonstrate the quality of patient care and enhance patient safety worldwide. International hospitals seek accreditation to demonstrate quality, and JCI accreditation is considered a seal of approval by medical travelers from the U.S.

The Hospital Accreditation (HA) process is a collective organizational commitment to quality improvement, organizational analysis, self-assessment, strategic formulation of

Nonetheless, you will be in a country not your own, so you should investigate everything as best you can, and ask questions until you are satisfied. You should also do some research and learn what you need to know about traveling to Thailand. We have compiled a few key points for you to think about below, which will make a good start for your preparation.

LOOK INTO ACCREDITATION

Safety Issues

DON'T GO IT ALONE

It's always best to use the buddy system, especially when traveling to a new destination abroad, even more so if you're going there to have a major operation performed. Chances are you may not be functioning at your peak performance levels, and a healthy friend or family member will be able to assist you in many ways, especially after your procedure.

There's nothing like a familiar face to comfort you when you're coming out of anesthesia, not to mention traveling together to a Thai beach before returning home.

PREPARE FOR THE UNEXPECTED

You can't anticipate everything that could go wrong from the time you leave your house to the time you return home with your health treatment behind you. However, you can think ahead and do your homework; then, you'll be more aware of some of the things that could possibly go wrong.

Talk to your travel agent, ask for advice and consult your home country's official travel advisory website. If there's been any trouble or specific problems in the area you plan to go, your travel advisory site will advise you of the situation and how to proceed.



The last thing you want is to be taken ill with something other than your primary affliction; for example, malaria, dengue fever or food poisoning. Therefore, it's best to place it safe until after your procedure is performed, Stay close to your hotel; eat in enclosed, airconditioned restaurants: and avoid dark, seedy areas at night.

Check and re-check the following until you know where everything is by heart: Where is my passport? Where are my emergency contact numbers? Where is my hotel information – in English and Thai? Is all my paperwork in order? When is my next appointment? Knowing all this will give you peace of mind, which is important before your treatment.

TRAVELING WITH YOUR MEDS

Traveling is not what it used to be. If you are going to need to take drugs and medications with you on your flight, do not simply assume that you'll be able to do so without advance preparation. We have listed some helpful advice for you in this regard below:

- Go to the airport early, so you won't need to rush and have plenty of time to clear security.
- Do not move your pills or drugs from their original marked containers. You may think it's a good idea for traveling, but it is definitely not. Airport and airline personnel will want to know exactly what medications you are carrying and see your name on the bottles.

- Keep a note from your doctor in the special bag you will buy for your medications. The note should clearly explain your medical condition and indicate what drugs you have been prescribed.
- Inform your airline during the booking process of your condition and the medications you will be hand-carrying with you on board the flight.
- At present, containers with over 100 ml of liquid are not allowed on flights. If you do have medications in liquid form, such as eye or ear drops, cough medicine or the like, you'll need to clear these with airport security in advance. Once again, go early, and keep your doctor's note with your medications.
- Since you should not really be traveling alone if you have a serious condition, make sure your travel companion is well-informed of your medications, especially any drugs that might be needed in the event of a complication or emergency.
- Keep track of time zones. You'll need to adjust your medications accordingly. Keep your watch set to your home time until you reach your hotel, where you can recalibrate your time settings and dosages.
- Finally, be sure you have an adequate supply of the medications you need to take before reaching your doctor or hospital in Thailand. That will be the place to re-stock, not in a pharmacy or chemist you happen to find on the street outside your hotel.

VACCINATIONS AND PRECAUTIONS

Thailand is a beautiful, safe, popular, modern tourist destination; however, it is also located in a tropical climate zone. Unless you've been to Thailand many times before, you're going to be exposed to local pathogens, bacteria and diseases your body may not have encountered before. Therefore, be prepared and play it safe by looking into the vaccinations you should have before traveling around the world.

Your travel agent or medical tourism provider will have a list of recommendations for you, since most vaccines are recommended and not mandatory. For a more authoritative list, visit the websites of the World Health Organization and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention.

Be sure to plan ahead as some vaccinations require advance time of several weeks or months; do not put this off until the last minute. You should begin preparing for your trip several months in advance in order to have plenty of time to take care of everything with time to spare.

KNOWLEDGE IS POWER – AND PROTECTION

The more you know about Thailand in general, and medical tourism in particular, the less chance there will be for something to go wrong. For example, legal recourse is not the same the world over. It may be worth looking into the laws on malpractice, for example. Check with your treatment center, your medical tourism agent if you have one and your own insurance company. You'll want to know what's covered and what isn't, just to be sure.

Once again, check your facility's credentials, accreditations and certifications. See if it has JCI or other international or local accreditation, and don't forget to check your personal doctor's credentials as well.

Many hospital websites now have blogs or forums associated with them; read them. Discuss your procedure or treatment with others who have already had it performed. Ask them what you need to be prepared

for, what you should bring and what you need to know. People love to share their experiences, and you will gain a world of knowledge this way.

For example, have you told your Thai treatment center about any preexisting medical conditions you have that might complicate surgery such as allergies or diabetes? What about special dietary needs? These are things to discuss before your treatment or procedure, not after. Send your hospital all your important information and files in advance.

AFTER THE OPERATION

Along these lines, be sure that your hospital or treatment center will be giving you adequate and sufficient follow-up care. Check all the details before committing to anything. Don't feel pressured into paying advances or down payments too quickly before you're totally confident about your treatment center's credentials and procedures.

After your medical procedure, do not rush off into the mountains on an adventure tour, go bungee jumping or fly home the next day thinking that all is now fine and dandy. Flying may seem passive and safe, but you're actually sitting at high altitudes in one position for long periods of time. Blood clots or DVT (Deep Venous Thrombosis) are not something you want after a heart operation.

You'll probably even be thinking of other reasons to return again in the future. ■ TRAVELING TO THAILAND

Whether your destination is Bangkok, Phuket, Chiang Mai, or the most remote provinces, you'll have no trouble getting there. All major cities have airports, and there are numerous border crossings to enter the Kingdom. Please see the following details regarding travel different options.

TYPES OF TRANSPORTATION

AIRLINES

As Bangkok is principal hub of mainland Southeast Asia, flying is certainly the most convenient way to reach Thailand from major airports around the world. There are also flights from many countries to major cities and tourist destinations, including Phuket, Chiang Mai, Krabi, Koh Samui, and Hat Yai, as well as Udon Thani in northeast Thailand.

In addition, there are many domestic flights every day, from Chiang Rai and Chiang Mai in the north to Phuket, Krabi, and Hat Yai in the south. An increasing number of low-cost airlines are now serving Thailand domestically and internationally as well.

BUS AND COACH

There are many buses traveling between Thailand and Laos, Cambodia, and Malaysia. The only country bordering Thailand where this is not possible is Myanmar, although there are flights between Bangkok and Yangon regularly.

From Laos, buses cross the Friendship Bridge traveling between Vientiane, Laos, and Nong Khai, Thailand, a small border town on the banks of the Mekong River. From Nong Khai, you can catch buses to elsewhere in Thailand, or you can continue on to the larger city of Udon Thani, two hours away. Udon Thani has an airport, as well as bus stations, so you can choose to continue your journey via plane or bus from there.

Should you be traveling north to Thailand from Malaysia, you can cross into Thailand at several different border crossings, including Yala, Narathiwat, or the main crossing into Songkhla province. Most every bus entering Thailand in the south will take you to Hat Yai, which is the hub for buses traveling to other Thai destinations.

If entering overland from Cambodia, from Battambang or Siem Reap, you will cross into Thailand at the border towns of Poipet, Cambodia and Aranyaprathet, Thailand. Here you'll need to disembark in Cambodia, cross over on foot, and arrange further transport from the Thailand side, which is not difficult.

TRAINS

The principle border crossing for visitors taking trains into Thailand is located near the Malaysian border town of Butterworth. Travelers from Singapore and Kuala Lumpur can travel by train north to Thailand, although it is necessary to change trains en route. The hours, as two changes of train are required. ■ TRAVELING IN THAILAND

Travel within Thailand is very convenient indeed. Thailand's transportation infrastructure is modern and well-organized, and makes exploring the country a very pleasant, convenient experience. Whether your preference is air, rail, bus, road, or water, you'll find opportunities almost everywhere to get where you want to go.



TYPES OF TRANSPORTATION

AIRLINES

Air travel is the fastest and most convenient way to travel around Thailand. Many Thai cities have airports with several flights that enable you to arrive in an hour rather than up to 12 hours by train or bus.

AIRPORT RAIL LINK

The Suvarnabhumi Airport Rail Link, or SARL, is a rapid transit line, which provides an airport rail link from Suvarnabhumi Airport, via Makkasan Station and City Air Terminal,

to Phaya Thai station in central Bangkok. It is connected to the MRT (subway) at Makkasan Station and to the BTS (skytrain) at Phyathai Station.

BUS & COACH

There are buses galore in Thailand and this is the most common form of transport for most Thais and many visitors as well. There are both public and private buses, cheap buses, and slightly more expensive private, or VIP,



CUSTOM TRANSFERS, LIMOUSINE SERVICES

Thailand also has specialized forms of transport available, many of them quite luxurious, such as limousine services. These may not be actual limousines in many cases, but they will be very comfortable vehicles of whichever type you choose, along with a driver and, in many cases, a guide.

CAR & VEHICLE HIRE

Most major car rental companies, such as Hertz and Avis, have offices throughout Thailand. In addition, there are many private rental companies in all of Thailand's larger cities. Although these local companies can be less expensive, please read the fine print to ensure you are covered correctly.

TAXIS

Bangkok is arguably the world's taxi paradise: nice cars, good service, meters, and they are everywhere. Best of all, the prices are much less than most other countries.

Taxis outside of Bangkok, especially in Pattaya, Koh Samui, and Phuket, will cost

more than in Bangkok. Simply agree on a price before getting in, and you'll be fine.

BANGKOK BTS SKYTRAIN AND MRT SUBWAY

Bangkok has both a subway and a skytrain, two relatively new forms of transport that have made life in the capital a great deal easier.

TRAINS

Trains are a great way to travel in Thailand, with lines linking Chiang Mai in the north to Bangkok, from where you can head north northeast to Nong Khai on the Laos border or east northeast to Ubon Ratchathani close to both Laos and Cambodia. Trains travel south as well to the Malaysian border, past Had Yai. Schedules and available seats are posted on www.railway.co.th.

TUK-TUKS

Tuk-tuks are so popular in Thailand that they are sometimes used as symbols for the country. These 3-wheeled motorized vehicles can be found everywhere in Thailand and are a great way to travel short distances.

BOATS

Tourists are well-advised to travel by water whenever possible in Bangkok, thus escaping the sometimes slow traffic jams. Take a river taxi on the Chao Phaya River for a few baht and you can take in many amazing sites. Get off at the Thaksin Bridge Station and you can continue via the BTS Skytrain.

There are also many ferries and speed boats from the mainland in the south out to any number of islands: such as Surat Thani to Koh Samui, Koh Phangan, and Koh Tao; and on the Andaman Sea side from Phuket or Krabi to Koh Phi Phi or other islands. Boats also run to islands east of Bangkok, such as from Ban Phe to Koh Samet, Laem Ngob to Koh Chang and Laem Sok to Koh Kood.

PRIVATE CHARTERS

Private charter flights can be booked throughout Thailand. They're an excellent way to see the Kingdom, and you can get to several places that would otherwise be very difficult to access. Many smaller airports throughout Thailand have services and facilities for charter flights that do not accommodate commercial flights.



THINGS TO DO IN THAILAND



Cultural exploration is one of the most popular activities for visitors to Thailand, given the Kingdom's rich culture, history, religion and mixture of peoples. This can be one of the most rewarding types of tourism you can engage in. Stay with a traditional Thai family in their home or head into the mountains to a guesthouse in one of Thailand's hilltribe villages. On the entertainment side, there are amazing cultural shows to be seen as well as the more physical, exciting bouts of Muay Thai, Thai boxing.



■ THINGS TO DO IN THAILAND

Thailand has something for everyone. Many countries make this claim, but as millions of visitors to Thailand each year can testify, it really is true of Thailand. This is because Thailand is not such a large country and has an excellent infrastructure. You can literally be relaxing on a beach in the morning and sleeping in a hilltribe village in the north in the evening.

Whether you're an active adventurous person or a sedate intellectual, Thailand can keep you enthralled for months. We cover some of the more popular activities that visitors enjoy for you, from cultural exploration to meditation; from outdoor adventures to educational activities; and from ecotourism and green travel to cruising and sailing. If you're visiting Thailand as a medical tourist, you'll never be at a loss for something to do, whether it's before or after your treatment.



CULTURAL EXPLORATION ACTIVITIES

LOCAL LIFESTYLE AND HOMESTAY

There is no better way to learn about and experience Thai culture up close and personal than actually staying with a Thai family in their own home. Start the day giving alms to the local Buddhist monks outside your homestay, and then, depending on the season, head out to the rice fields to see and learn how most rural Thais plant rice and farm their land. Many homestays also have other activities set up for you to enjoy such as Thai cooking lessons or making local handicrafts.

This is a wonderful way for you and your family, or your friends, to cut right to the chase and learn what the real Thailand is all about. Increasingly, visitors are shying away from mainstream mass tourism to experience genuine Thai culture, and a homestay visit is often, if not always, remembered as a great highlight of one's trip to Thailand.

HILLTRIBES (MOUNTAIN PEOPLES)

Akha, Lahu, Lisu, Hmong, Yao and Karen. The very names of these hilltribes, or "mountain peoples", conjure up exotic images of colorful villages peppered throughout northern Thailand. These small groups of villagers dispersed from China and Burma about 100 years ago and have lived in northern Thailand ever since. Many have constructed questhouses in their villages and tourists have been visiting and learning about their cultures for decades now.

Starting in Chiang Mai, you can venture out to explore these minority cultural villages on day trips or longer 3-5-day excursions. Chiang Rai is the most popular province for these tours and treks, but you'll find more remote, traditional villages around Mae Hong Son and Mae Sariang, within a lovely, scenic day's drive from Chiang Mai. For those interested in other cultures, traditions, languages, religion and costume, this is one activity not to be missed.

CULTURAL SHOWS

For an exciting and novel evening's entertainment, a cultural show may be just flavors and colors of shows throughout Thailand, be it in Phuket, Pattaya, Bangkok or Chiang Mai, Some of these shows are worldclass spectaculars, with sound and light shows, elaborate costumes and incredible production designs. Others are more simple singing, dancing and music.

In Chiang Mai, "khan toke" dinner shows are Muay Thai is an exciting cultural activity to very popular, where guests are seated on mats around a round table ("toke"), partake of northern Thai food and enjoy northern Thai and hilltribe dancing. This is a classic case of skill over size, as many inexperienced foreigners learn very quickly, after receiving a roundhouse kick or two in the gut.

2 ECOTOURISM / GREEN TRAVEL

Ecotourism, or green travel, has been popular in Thailand for many years due to an abundance of natural resources, from the pine forests in the north to the awesome maritime caves in the south.

There is a wide range of ecotourism activities to enjoy in Thailand. These include trekking and hiking, nature and wildlife observation, bird watching, horseback riding, mountain biking, bamboo rafting, rock climbing and much more.



ECOTOURISM / GREEN TRAVEL ACTIVITIES

TREKKING, HIKING

Chiang Mai has become something of the ecotourism capital of Southeast Asia in recent years, and there are scores of wonderful tours and treks for you to enjoy in northern Thailand. Chiang Mai and her little sister Chiang Rai are virtually synonymous with mountain treks and are the perfect bases for heading out from the city into the jungles and mountains.

There are day-trips as well as much longer tours and treks, depending on how much time you have and wish to immerse yourself in this fascinating cultural experience. Most treks pass through at least one remote village. The longer treks make a stopover in a jungle village for the night, where you'll enjoy a hearty meal and usually be entertained by hilltribe dancers and cultural shows.

Many tours combine a variety of activities in addition to hiking such as bamboo rafting, elephant treks, oxcart rides and cycling. There are also resorts and retreats throughout the north where you can stay for a few days learning skills such as Thai cooking, massage, meditation and the use of tropical herbs and spices for treatments. There are no shortage of activities for nature lovers in Thailand.

NATURE & WILDLIFE OBSERVATION

Thailand is divided into a number of distinct ecological zones, each with its own dazzling array of flora and fauna. You can choose from over 100 national parks, including more than 20 marine parks, according to your interests.

Each zone has its own unique characteristics, wildlife and vegetation, from the cool temperate forests of the north to the tropical rainforests in the south. There is a stunning array of wildlife to observe in all these parks, including gibbons, elephants, bears, monkeys, porcupines, birds and fish.

Some of the top spots for enjoying nature and observing wildlife in their natural habitat are Khao Yai National Park, frequently rated as one of the world's best national parks and an ASEAN heritage site, and Huay Kha Khaeng-Thung Yai Naresuan Wildlife Sanctuary, near the Burmese border designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1991.

Furthermore, high on the list are Kaeng Krachan National Park, Thailand's largest wildlife sanctuary, and Erawan National Park, with its unforgettable Erawan Waterfall, considered one of the most beautiful in Asia by many. Rounding out the list are Bung Boraphet Marine Sanctuary, Thailand's largest freshwater lake, and Hat Thai Muang National Park in Phang Nga, famous as a popular breeding ground for rare sea turtles.

BIRD WATCHING

Thailand is a very special destination for bird watchers, with close to 1,000 different species living in its different ecological zones.there are special tours exclusively for birders, and some renowned bird watchers who also conduct birding tours live in thailand.

Bird watchers love coming to thailand, as its well-developed infrastructure and facilities lets you get out into the wild, while not having to sacrifice comfort or amenities since great resorts and retreats exist nearby popular birding areas.

The most popular bird watching areas are probably Phang nga bay in Phuket and Khao Sok National Park, famous for its hornbill population. Additionally, birders should look into Khao Yai National Park, Khao Sam Roi Yod National Park, Doi Chiang Dao north of Chiang Mai, Bung Boraphet and Bangpoo in Samut Prakan province.

3 OUTDOOR AND ADVENTURE

Thailand's natural resources and diversity provide many opportunities for outdoor and adventure activities. You can find all types available in Thailand, from rock climbing to elephant riding and from mountain biking to 4WD and off-road driving, which we describe below. You can find more exciting extreme activities such as bungee jumping near the major tourist areas such as Pattaya and Koh Samui.

If there was one activity that most tourists would not want to miss in Thailand, it's probably elephant riding.

OUTDOOR AND ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES

ROCK CLIMBING

Most rock climbers agree that it's hard to find a more spectacular country to climb in than Thailand. Especially noteworthy are the many rock faces available in Railey Beach, Krabi province, near Phuket in southern Thailand. Most enthusiasts eventually end up at Phra Nang Cape, midway between Krabi and Ao Nang Beach, where there are more than available for climbers of all levels. These limestone cliffs jutting dramatically out of the landscape make ideal surfaces for climbing, and the sand and beaches below are just an added bonus. Be sure to take your cameras!

ELEPHANT RIDING

If there was one activity that most tourists do not want to miss in Thailand, it's probably elephant riding, high on everyone's list. SCUBA DIVING

Most of the beach resorts in Thailand provide opportunities for scuba diving. you can surely do so at all the gorgeous destinations where diving is offered. Many snorkelers enjoy taking trips via speedboat from the major beaches of Phuket, Pattaya, Koh Samui and other islands.

WHITE WATER RAFTING

The rains that begin each year in late May through June are a welcome respite from the heat of the hot season and the signal to plant rice. For many adventure tourists, it means the waters are rising in Thailand's rivers and it's time for some exciting white water rafting. Several tour operators in different parts of the Kingdom offer rafting trips with rapids chosen according to your skill and experience, with class one through five rapids available. Pai in Mae Hong Son is one of the most popular rafting destinations, followed by, in no specific order, Chiang Mai, Tak, Phetchaburi, Kanchanaburi, Surat Thani, Nakhon Nayok and Phitsanulok.

SEA KAYAKING

Thailand has a plethora of exotic fish species, including some of the largest freshwater fish in the world, the Buk, or Giant Mekong Catfish, which need to be seen to be believed. Also popular are Giant Siamese Carp, Giant Stingrays and Giant Snakehead fish. Sport fishermen should head towards Phuket and Pattaya, where they can fish for barracuda, sailfish, grouper and red snapper. You can choose to fish on your own if you like at fishing parks or farms, or join fishing tours – or even tournaments – if you feel you're up for it. You're sure to return home with some amazing fish stories.

6 EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Many tourists come to Thailand these days to study something they've always wanted to learn. They have time on their hands, and Thailand has the resources, experience and great prices available for visitors to undertake a course of study in something they've always dreamed of doing.

At the top of the list are probably Thai cooking, Thai massage, Muay Thai boxing and scuba diving certification. Also many people are interested in receiving instructions in golf, rock climbing, even flying.



EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

THAI COOKING CLASSES

Given the popularity of Thai cuisine, it's no surprise that many people would like to learn how to make it. Accordingly, Thai cooking schools can now be found throughout the country, offering lessons of different lengths, from half a day to a full week, enabling you to learn to make different types of dishes every day. Nearly every tourist destination, from Phuket to Chiang Mai, has various versions of cooking classes available - with many of them taught in English. You'll learn to shop in the market and then proceed to learning about curries, salads and desserts. Best of all, you get to eat all the food when you've finished preparing it.





SCUBA DIVING SCHOOLS

Given Thailand's geography which includes a long isthmus with two coasts, you can learn diving throughout the year. All types of diving are available, from wreck diving to cave systems, drop offs and holes. The marine life is stunning and the waters are beautiful. Koh Tao is typically high on all divers' lists, followed by Phuket, the Similans and Pattaya.

The biggest small island in Southeast Asia for diving has to be Koh Tao (Turtle Island), which has more than 40 dive centers operating on the island. Koh Tao has more than 25 superb dive sites within close proximity that suit every standard of diver - with shallow protected bays for total novices to deeper pinnacles for the experienced veterans.

Although PADI is the most famous certification available in Thailand, many diving courses and certifications such as NAUI and SSI's diving instructions are also available at major diving destinations in Thailand. Courses range from beginner to dive master, with instructors teaching in many languages.

GOLF SCHOOLS

With Thailand's huge selection of quality courses, it's no surprise that a number of golfing schools have sprung up, along with golf travel packages, during which one can learn to golf properly with experienced pros. There are packages available for many different budgets, and you can choose your favorite location to learn and play, be it Chiang Mai, Pattaya, Hua Hin, Phuket, or Koh Samui. As far as courses go, Thailand has an embarrassment of riches, with more than 200 courses spread around the country, including some truly classic courses, Springfield Village Golf & Spa, Blue Canyon Country Club, Summit Windmill Golf Club and Alpine Golf and Sports Club.

ROCK CLIMBING SCHOOLS

For something different, active tourists might want to learn how to rock climb in some of excellent massage courses, with a basic the most amazing spots in the world. Railey Beach in Krabi is probably the hottest spot to learn the ropes in an awesome setting. Courses last from one to three days, with longer courses being recommended to learn the more expert skills properly. Anyone interested is welcome, from young children improved physical fitness. to their grandparents. In addition to Railey Beach, Chiang Mai and Koh Phi Phi are the main destinations for those wanting to learn to rock climb as well as face ever more challenging faces. This course teaches a basic traditional Thai massage to relieve fatique, muscular cramps, stress and nervous tension. The therapy is intended to make muscles and joints more supple and to stimulate the blood and lymph circulation for

If you're the more physical type and want a more active fitness course during your visit to Thailand, you might consider taking a Muay Thai - or Thai boxing - course. Because of its increasing renown and popularity throughout the world, there are now options available for both novices and more seasoned fighters. usually taught in both Thai and English. Some of the more popular places to learn Muay Thai are located in Pattaya, Bangkok and Phuket.

Every type of cruise you can imagine is available in Thailand, and not only at the beaches in Phuket, Pattaya and Koh Samui. There's something classically romantic about a dinner cruise that adds a special touch to your Thai holiday, and you can enjoy a wonderful dinner while cruising the Chao Phraya River in Bangkok, the Mekong River in Nong Khai or the Ping River in Chiang Mai.

Some of the best cruises are based out of Phuket, where you can take multi-day adventures on converted Chinese junks if you like. These are traditional vessels converted to provide you with modern amenities and Western comforts, like air-conditioned cabins,

superb meals and frequent stops to snorkel, swim or walk on the beach. Or you can hire a long-tail boat yourself, and island-hop around the bay if this is more to your taste.

There are also many yacht charter agencies in Phuket, Pattaya and Koh Samui, where you can charter a vacht for as long as you like, take the helm and sail off into the sunset. There are many private charters available to some amazing destinations, including the Surin Islands and Koh Tarutao Marine National Park. You can even take lessons and learn to sail yourself if you like. There is a wide range of vessels, activities and destinations for you to consider, and there are options available to satisfy all budgets.


8 MEDITATION

Since most Thais are Buddhists, there are thousands of spectacular Buddhist temples throughout Thailand. In addition, since Buddhism is such an open, compassionate religion, one can literally walk into almost any Mahatat, near Bangkok's Grand Palace. All temple, or Buddhist compound, in the country major temples have shops selling books on and feel most welcome. There are meditation retreats all over Thailand where anyone can go to learn the teachings of the Lord Buddha and the principles of Buddhist meditation.

you convert to Buddhism and leave your old religion behind. You are simply welcomed because of your interest, and everyone will be happy to share what they know with you. Meditation centers have been popular in Thailand for many years; and as Westerners have long been coming to Thailand to learn, many courses are taught in English. There are many places of meditation in Thailand that are free of charge, but you can choose to donate something to the temple or the meditation centers to assist with their expenses.

You can elect to learn meditation formally or informally: for example, there are weekly "monk chats" at Wat Chedi Luang or Wat Suan Dok in Chiang Mai. You can also check yourself in at these temples, if you like, for a week or longer, for more intensive courses of study. You should, however, learn what is expected and required of you in these places, since you will be following rigorous rules regarding when you are allowed to eat, not speaking for long periods as well, behaviors that will require some effort and will on your part.

Many people choose to explore Buddhism and meditation more slowly at first, and there are some places where longer term time commitments are not required, such as Wat Buddhism and meditation as well. You might simply visit these temples initially, get a feel for the sacred atmosphere of such places and do some reading before committing to any long retreats. You'll know when you're ready, and It's not necessary - or even expected - that all who seriously commit to these courses testify to the life-changing experiences they have had in them.

SHOPPING

Thailand is famous the world over for being a shopper's paradise, where almost anything is available and unique items can always be found. At the top of the list are probably Thai antiques; then Thai arts and crafts such as painting, wood carvings, lacquerware, pewterware, and nielloware. Thai toys and dolls are also very popular items, along with artificial flowers, handmade furniture and many small novelty items unique to Thailand. More sought after items include Thai gems and jewelry, gold and silverware and world-renowned Thai silk.

Community-based products are also very popular. These items are made in communities throughout Thailand, and are known collectively as OTOP (One Tambon One Product) products ("tambon" means "district" in Thai). Thailand also has many large markets that sell almost everything under the sun, and great deals can be had.

POPULAR THAI PRODUCTS

ANTIQUES & COLLECTIBLES

There are many antique and collectible items available in shops and markets throughout Thailand, though you need to bear in mind that the term "antique" is often used generally to mean both genuine, very old antiques, and more recently made antique-appearing items. Genuine antiques require permission to export from the Department of Fine Arts, while items simply made to look old or weathered do not. Authentic antique dealers are capable of assisting you with completing the necessary documentation you will need to send these items out of the country.

ARTS & CRAFTS

Thailand is home to many artists and artisans, who make a dazzling variety of paintings and products. It is popular to commission custom paintings or custom items of any type from the people making them. Woodcarvings are among the most popular products, and these items are found in northern Thailand. In fact, Chiang Mai is known as the handicraft capital of Thailand. Tribal goods can be found at the famous Night Market as well as at weekly markets and neighboring handicraft villages. Other handicrafts appreciated by visitors include smaller items that can easily be packed such as lacquerware, bamboo, rattan and sedge products. Please see the end of this section for specific places to purchase these items.

ELECTRICAL & ELECTRONICS

Electrical and electronic items are manufactured in huge quantities in Thailand. mostly for export, although many items are sold domestically as well. There are several malls famous for electronic items in Banakok. including MBK and Panthip Plaza, the latter specializing in computer-related products. There are good deals to be had on many of these items, although the buyer should check the items carefully before making any purchases.

FABRICS

Thai fabrics are highly desired products and the envy of the world. When foreigners think Thailand is world famous for its gorgeous of Thailand, it is usually with thoughts of Thai food, Thai massage, Thai boxing and Thai silk. These are also great items for travelers to take home as gifts, since shirts, scarves, ties and sashes are highly portable items. Thai cotton and batik are also popular items, particularly when sold as rugs, bags, clothing. table and bed linens. One special type of silk has become very stylish in the past few years. Known as mudmee, it is a unique item made from tie-dyed silk threads that are woven into a number of unique and beautiful designs. Mudmee can be found primarily in Isan, the rural northeast area of Thailand, heading towards the border with Laos.

GOLD, GEMS, & JEWELRY

Thailand is known as the gold and gem hub

gold and gemstones are made into exquisite jewelry. There are many opportunities for good deals in the Chinese districts of Bangkok, the largest of which is Yaowarat or Chinatown. Thai gold is unusually yellow, and amateurs often think it is not real gold. The truth is that it is a much higher purity than gold used in the West and is thus softer as well. Due to lower labor costs, beautiful jewelry can be found in Thailand for very reasonable prices. It is advised that you purchase gold, gems or jewelry in well-known department stores or large gold and jewelry shops to be sure of getting genuine products.

THAI ORCHIDS

■ COMMUNITY-BASED PRODUCTS IN THAILAND

Anyone who has done some unique products to purchase and traveling throughout Thailand knows about OTOP shops. those excellent shops along the roadside in each province that sell unique, quality products chosen especially from their particular districts. OTOP, or One Tambon One Product (tambon meaning district), is a national scheme inspired by the traditional arts, crafts and specialties of every province in Thailand.

This has been a wonderfully successful conservation program through which local villagers can make money while preserving traditional skills of their own locals. It has generated pride in their labor, their products and their provinces, and has provided high quality products. tourists with exceptional and

take away with them.

Furthermore, some OTOP villages also function as homestays, inviting tourists to stay with them to see how these products are actually made. Visitors get to experience the lifestyle of the local people making these products, see local historical sites and experience local culture in a very intimate fashion.

OTOP has become an international quality brand and is increasingly sought after by both domestic and international tourists as well as the international marketplace. The following are some OTOP villages of note that produce especially



BAN DON KAI DEE

Many villagers in Ban Don Kai Dee once worked for the Kai brand bowl and plate manufacturer. However, the plant eventually closed down, leaving many villagers unemployed. Eventually, they pooled all their resources, knowledge and experience, and they began producing Benjarong porcelain. The government became aware of this and began supporting them. In 2011, they won the Best Handicraft Village Award 2011. Now, many villagers have found a new career making these ceramics and selling them via the OTOP scheme – one of many OTOP success stories.

BAN ARANYIK (BAN TON PO AND BAN PAI NONG)

Actually, the early inhabitants of Ban Ton Po village were from Vientiane, Laos and had migrated to the Ayuttaya area during the reign of King Rama II. They chose this area because it had excellent land and a good water supply. Subsequently, Ban Ton Po became famous for handicraft manufacturing, in particular, for making the "Aranyik Knife". The knife got its name from the place the knives were initially sold, in the nearby Aranyik Gambling House. These knives are made from imported high quality steel and have become very desirable products, so much so that the villagers have gone on to make spoons and forks to go with them, as well as candle holders, fruit trays and related products.

BAN BANG CHAO CHA

Ban Bang Chao Cha is an ancient community that has long lived in central Thailand's Chainat province. Previously, like most villagers, they made their living from farming. Later, they began weaving rattan brought into Thailand across the border from neighboring Burma. The villagers wove the rattan together with bamboo to make very durable products, beginning with everyday tools such as baskets, and moving on to more modern items in recent times such as bags and home décor products. This area is now famous for these quality products.

KHIRIWONG VILLAGE

This area is famous for its beautiful, high quality tie-dyed cloth and has won 5-Star OTOP awards for two consecutive years.

KOH KRED VILLAGE

Koh Kred is an island in the center of the Chao Phraya River, previously famous as a trading area for riverboats. Historically, the Mon began making earthenware pottery after they migrated to this area. It is a distinctive light orange to reddish color and has elaborate carvings on it as well as ancient Mon compositions engraved onto the products. These unusually beautiful products in such a unique location have attracted tourists from everywhere.

The reason it does so is because of the high iron ore content of the earth from the Mun River used in making the pottery. When heated, all the elements melt together and create a strong, glossy and colorful product, compared to the red color in the blood of an eel.

Some of the most common and popular ingredients are coriander, galangal, turmeric and basil. These are well-known antioxidants that have anti-inflammatory properties, boost the immune system, and fight dangerous toxins and free radicals that can do harm to your body.

Another tasty yet beneficial ingredient in many Thai dishes is lemongrass, known to relieve headaches and reduce stomach cramps. It's amazing that a bowl of spicy, delicious tom yum soup can be eaten instead of some expensive pharmaceutical that may or may not work. The

Chinese have known this for centuries, and long used it as a tonic.

pump for the body, it turns out that two more common ingredients used in many Thai dishes can help you have a healthy, happy heart: coconut milk and chili peppers. Despite what you may have heard about coconut milk in the past, research has shown that both coconut milk and coconut oil are much better for you than butter and most vegetable oils, as they increase "good" cholesterol while lowering "bad" cholesterol.

As for those spicy chilies that true lovers of Thai food enjoy, perhaps in moderation, it is being demonstrated that after eating these fiery little peppers, you'll not only fall asleep faster, but sleep longer and better.

As if this weren't enough reason to continue enjoying some wonderful food, it turns out that the Thai method of cooking vegetables lightly, often with Thai holy basil and other herbs and spices mentioned above, bestow excellent anti-aging benefits. Coconut milk has skin-enhancing fatty acids; holy basil contains calming elements; and turmeric, with its anti-inflammatory properties, even helps fight arthritis.

It is rare to find something that tastes so good and is actually good for you as well, but Thai food is both. This is one pleasure you need not feel guilty about. You'll not only look better as a result of eating Thai cuisine, but feel better, which all leads to a long, healthy, happy life. After all, you are what you eat; so eat Thai,

HERE IS A MORE IN-DEPTH LOOK AT SOME OF THE MOST POPULAR - AND HEALTHY - HERBS AND SPICES USED IN THAI COOKING, AND SOME OF THE KNOWN HEALTH BENEFITS THAT THEY BESTOW:

TURMERIC: "KHA-MIN" IN THAI

The active ingredient in turmeric is curcumin, an anti-inflammatory agent. Turmeric is a member of the ginger family and provides the yellow coloring for Thai food. Turmeric is an antioxidant, and curcumin improves blood circulation and protects the platelets in your blood. It is also an anti-flatulent. Try some chicken curry to get your turmeric fix.

GALANGA: "KHA" IN THAI

Galanga (or greater galangal) has orangeybrown skin with a pale yellow or white interior. It is an erect annual plant with aromatic, ginger-like rhizomes, and is very common in Thai cooking as a flavoring. Galanga resembles ginger in its effects and is an aromatic stimulant, carminative and stomachic. It is used against nausea, flatulence, dyspepsia, rheumatism, catarrh and enteritis. And, tom kha gai (chicken coconut milk soup) is one of Thailand's most delicious dishes that uses galanga.

LEMON GRASS: "TA-KHRAI" IN THAI

Lemon Grass is an aromatic herb that has robust, lemon scented linear leaves that grow up to three feet tall. The stems, leaves and essential oil are used. It has a pleasant lemony fragrance and has antimicrobial, analgesic, antipyretic, antioxidant and antifungal properties. Fresh leaves and grass are used as flavoring in many Thai dishes. It has other therapeutic properties including diuretic, emmanagogue, antiflatulent and anti-flu agent.





SWEET BASIL: "BAI HORAPA" IN THAI

Sweet basil is a very popular Thai herb. It has small, dark leaves with reddish-purple stems and flowers. Its flavor is akin to aniseed, and it is somewhat stronger than Western sweet basil. Potential benefits include: stimulating the brain, clearing the mind, aiding in concentration, increasing endurance and stamina. Therapeutic properties proscribed to sweet basil include carminative, diaphoretic, expectorant, digestant and stomachic agents. It is both eaten raw and added to dishes as a flavoring.

CORIANDER: "PUK CHEE" IN THAI



Commonly known as cilantro, the seeds taken from these leafy leaves used in most cuisines are known as coriander. In Thai cooking, coriander is used in two ways: in its seed form, and as a fresh herb. In the West, coriander is also known as "Chinese parsley". Considered to be rich in various food elements, the coriander leaves contain protein, fat, minerals, fiber, carbohydrates and water. The minerals and vitamins include: vitamin C. calcium, phosphorus. iron, carotene, thiamine, riboflavin, niacin, sodium, potassium and oxalic acid. While fresh coriander has nutritional value, it is also known as a good treatment for gastrointestinal trouble (including gas and bloating), digestive problems, bacterial and fungal infections.

CHILI PEPPERS: "PHRIK" IN THAI (FRESH OR DRIED, WHOLE, MINCED OR POWDERED)

Chilies, famous around the world for spiciness,

may be the one indispensable item at the Thai table. The nutritional aspect of hot peppers most interesting to researchers today, however, is capsaicin, the compound that gives chilies their "burn." Capsaicin seems to have a positive effect on blood cholesterol, and also works as an anticoagulant. The "high" that some people experience when eating fiery chili-spiked foods is a perfectly safe one: Some scientists theorize that in response to the discomfort produced by the chilies' "burn," the brain releases endorphins, substances that, at high levels, can create a sensation of pleasure. Other therapeutic uses include being a carminative, anti-flatulence agent and digestant. Recent human studies show that eating chilies helps you sleep better. keeps your heart healthy, and helps maintain consistent insulin and glucose levels. Thais put them in almost everything.





COCONUT MILK: "CATI" IN THAI

Coconut milk's reputation has been changing. Previously considered somewhat unhealthy, it is now found that coconut milk and oil do indeed contain fat, but it is the good, not the bad type. The benefits of coconut milk are many: it lowers bad cholesterol (LDL), while promoting good cholesterol (HDL); it boosts one's immune system and regulates metabolic functions. Coconut milk is considered very healthy in Ayurveda and, in modern times, has been found to have hyperlipidemic balancing qualities as well as antimicrobial properties in the gastrointestinal tract. It is used in Thai curries, sweets and the most decadent Thai dish in the pantheon: mango with sticky rice (khao niaw ma-muang).

LIME: "MA-NAO" IN THAI

The lime – not to be confused with the lemon – is very popular all through the tropics and is used as a required complement to most every meal. It is highly regarded as a health-building food of great value, with almost unlimited powers, including: aiding weight loss, skin care, good digestion, relief from constipation, eye care, as well as treatment of scurvy, piles, peptic ulcers, respiratory disorders, gout, gums, urinary disorders, and the list goes on. The fruit contains hesperidin and naringin, proven anti-inflammatory flavonoids. The rind of the fruit also has medicinal properties. Lime is often mixed with cooked pulses, soups, sauces and gravies to make them more tasty and enjoyable.



HOLY BASIL: "BAI KAPROW" IN THAI

Holy (or sacred) basil has a purple stem and purple leaves with a slightly hot flavor. The fresh leaves, which are used as a flavoring, contain approximately 0.5 % volatile oil, which exhibits antimicrobial activity, specifically as a carminative, diaphoretic, expectorant and stomachic. It will help to expel flatulence and ease griping pains in the abdomen. The essential oil obtained from this plant contains camphor.





GINGER: "KHING" IN THAI

Ginger has been used in many cultures since ancient times. It has long been appreciated as an aid to digestion, and numerous studies have shown that it is effective against nausea. Ginger has also been shown to have antimicrobial and antiviral properties, so consuming it while you're sick may aid recovery. Ginger root is also used to treat nausea related to both motion sickness and morning sickness. It is used in different forms as a food, flavouring and spice. Ginger's therapeutic uses are as a carminative, antinauseant and antiflatulent agent. Other therapeutic properties include stimulating circulation of the blood, removing toxins from the body, cleansing the bowels and kidneys, and nourishing the skin. It is used in many forms in Thai dishes as well as in hot and cold beverages.

GARLIC: "KRA-THIAM" IN THAI

to the same family as onions, chives, leeks and scallions. It is an annual herbaceous plant with underground bulbs made up of several cloves. Garlic is one of the kings of spices and is considered to be nature's very own antibiotic. Garlic has also been used for lowering cholesterol, reducing high blood pressure and treating respiratory problems such as bronchitis and asthma. Therapeutic uses are as an antimicrobial, diaphoretic, diuretic, expectorant, antiflatulent and cholesterol lowering agents. It is used in many Thai dishes, especially in conjunction with black peppers.

Garlic is a bulb of a lily-like plant, belonging

Not only that, but three other Thai dishes made the World's Top 50 chart: world famous tom yum goong (spicy prawn soup) placed a respectable #8; Isan's nam tok mu (spicy

pork salad) was not far behind at #19 and the ever-popular som tum (papaya salad) was ranked #46. (See: http://www.cnngo.com/ explorations/eat/worlds-50-most-deliciousfoods-067535?page=0,2)

Gaeng massaman was described as "emphatically the king of curries, and perhaps the king of all foods. Spicy, coconutty, sweet

and savory, its combination of flavors has more personality than a Thai election." Massaman crushed all the world's most delicious offerings, including Japanese sushi (#4), Mexican chocolate (#3), and Neapolitan pizza (#2) to reign as the world's champ.

HOW TO COOK MASSAMAN CURRY:

- 1. If making your own paste, dry roast the dry spices in a pan on medium heat until fragrant, about 2-4 minutes. It's best to roast each thing one at a time until fragrant. The chilies should be browned. Roast the shrimp paste wrapped in tin foil for a few minutes too.
- 2. Soak the dried chilies until soft, then take out the seeds and inner bits and chop fine.
- 3. Pound the paste in a stone mortar & pestle. Start by grinding up the dried spices until powdered, then set aside. Put the chilies in the mortar and pound until uniformly smashed, and then add the rest of the ingredients, starting from hardest and driest and working up to softest at the end. Then add the dried spice powder back in and the shrimp paste. Mix well. If using a food processor, just mix it all in together. If using canned paste, skip these three steps.
- 4. Cut the potatoes and onions into bite-sized pieces and wash the chicken.
- 5. Add the oil to the pan and turn on to medium high. Fry 4 tablespoons of the paste until fragrant, about 3-4 minutes. Keep stirring so it doesn't burn.
- 6. Add the whole chicken pieces. Fry until the chicken is sealed on the outside, about 2-3 minutes.

- 7. Add 1-cup of the coconut cream (top part of the can if using canned - don't shake the can). Simmer until the oil separates, about 2-3 minutes. You'll see reddish oil starting to float to the top.
- 8. Add the potatoes, peanuts and onions and the 1-cup of coconut milk. Simmer for a few minutes.
- 9. Add the cinnamon, cardamom seeds, cassia leaves. Mix well.
- 10. Simmer (and stir well) until the mixture browns and a good deal of oil comes to the top. About 15-20 minutes. If it gets too dry, add some water. Add the fish sauce, palm sugar, and tamarind juice at the end. Taste - you may need to adjust the flavor if it's not salty or sour enough.
- 11. Serve with rice or roti. It also is great with ajaat (slightly pickled cucumber salad) on the side.
