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Thailand has long been known for the most attentive and pampering hospitality. This is often reflected in the very luxurious and lavish as well as chic and trendy accommodation found in Bangkok as well as in the lush, verdant mountains of the north and the shimmering coastline and islands of the Thai Gulf and Andaman Sea.





The Chao Phraya, or River of Kings, has served since the beginning of time immemorial as the lifeblood for the Thai kingdom and its culture. So, we begin our journey on the banks in Bangkok, or The City of Angles. For more than 100 years, **Mandarin Oriental**, **Bangkok** (www.mandarinoriental.com/bangkok) and its Royal Oriental Suite has served as a paragon for service and luxury. Hosting royalty and heads of state, this two-bedroom penthouse suite embodies













the quintessence of elegance and comfort with its very sumptuous décor. A little further north on the opposite bank, and we can see the Jewel in the Crown of The Peninsula Bangkok tower (www. peninsula.com/Bangkok), the Peninsula Suite. Once you step into this 34th-floor, rooftop residence, while the décor itself is exquisite, the panoramic vistas of Bangkok metropolis and the Chao Phraya are unrivaled. The living room, featuring rich woodwork and Persian rugs that compliment the traditional furnishings upholstered in hues of golden silks, is ideal for entertaining. Meanwhile, formal and private dining rooms and a private study provide a fine selection of options for more intimate or official gatherings. Step back in time at The Siam (www.the-

siamhotel.com), to experience the allure of Bangkok's riverside at the turn of the 20th century when King Chulalongkorn reigned. Featuring 39 spacious suites set on 2.8 acres of Chao Phraya frontage, this brand new boutique gem boasts the capital's premier private Pool Villas (including Connie's Thai Cottage), a stylish Art Deco main residence replete with antiques, a seductive spa as well as a signature Thai restaurant and cooking school set in ancient teakwood homes transported to Bangkok from Ayutthaya by silk-tycoon, Jim Thompson, and fellow curio collector, Connie Mangskau. Herein, they entertained such notables as Jacqueline Kennedy, Henry Ford, John Rockefeller and Roger Moore. Designed and landscaped by Bill Bensley, named in 2009 by Architectural Digest as one of the "Top 100 Designers and Most Creative People", The Siam offers a harmonious blend of colonial grandeur and modern luxury in a setting of serene, verdant charm. Opening August 2011.

Other noteworthy havens of luxury along the Chao Phraya River include the heavenly Shangri-La Hotel (www.shangrila. com/bangkok), the stately Millennium Hilton (www.hilton.com), and the inviting Royal Orchid Sheraton (www.royalorchidsheraton.com).

From the river, we move to the cosmopolitan city center and Grand Hyatt Erawan Bangkok's Presidential Suite (www.bangkok.grand.hyatt.com) that has played second home to world dignitaries and diplomats. A décor that plush contemporary and traditional Thai including polished teak parquet floors, the suite features every modern amenity, particularly those to help release all your tension and rejuvenate such as a massage treatment room, marble baths, sauna, deep soaking spa pool and whirlpool. In addition to private concierge service, a butler is always on duty to cater to guests' specific needs as well.



In the same vicinity, nestled amidst a lush and colorful tropical eight-acre garden in the same vicinity is Swissôtel Nai Lert Park (www.swissotel.com). This verdant sanctuary offers a host of accommodations, including its Presidential Suite that features very private balconies that open to the gardens and their fragrances as well as the symphony of sounds created by the songs of birds, the caress of breezes and patter of rainfall on the swaying palms and dense flora. One more hotel in the city center offering unrivaled luxury is Ma Du Zi Hotel, Bangkok (www.maduzihotel.com), particularly if you reserve 79 Suite. The room's Japanese minimalist-style décor is a blend of exquisite woodwork, including floors, doors of built-in closets and sculpted furnishings, and ultramodern ergonomic seating and an extra expansive 8 x 6.5-foot bed with posturepedic mattress to ensure the most rejuvenating sleep. Another newly opened Siam Kempinski Hotel (www. kempinski.com/en/bangkok) can claim to be a luxurious oasis in the heart of the capital.

It is unbelievable how quickly you can get away from Bangkok's concrete caverns and hectic lifestyles to be in the middle of the verdant undulating terrain of Khao Yai, where the timber grows tall,

the pace is slow within a symphony of natural sounds. Perched on a hilltop is the ultra-luxurious boutique Sala Khaoyai (www.salaresorts.com/khaoyai) and its Sala Pool Villa Suites that blend Thai traditional with contemporary designs using native woods, leather and local hand-woven fabrics. Each with its own private swimming pool and fireplaces, one on the rooftop deck and a second inside, they can accommodate your every wish no matter the season or time of day. A quintessential mountain romance retreat is Muthi Maya Forest Pool Villa Resort (www.muthimaya.com), which has been aptly described as a 'luscious oasis of serenity'. Recently selected as one of the world's ten top most romantic resorts in the world, by renowned resort reviewers, Mr. and Mrs. Smith, Muthi Maya offers you liberation from illusion. The highlight of the resort is its Orient-inspired open-air architecture using natural materials carefully selected to blend with the surroundings. Each Pool Villa, nestled at different heights on the hillsides, boasts amenities that include a private pool, large Jacuzzi and sundeck served by a 24hour Romanceologist (romance butler) available on request.


Traveling to Thailand's northern region, our first stop is mountainous Mae Hong Son and the riverside town of Pai that has evolved into a hip, café cultured

retreat. And while the town retains its northern Thai charm, Montis Deluxe (www.montisresort.com) villas also offer an escape into the mesmerizing fascination of Africa. Clustered together like an African tribal village around a tranquil lagoon nestled below a ranges of jungle-clad peaks, each thatched-roofed, dome-shaped, stone villa offers a slightly different motif based on a wild animal of Africa. The interiors are a blend of terracotta tile and plank floors, blond wood furnishings and hues from maroon and saffron to dark browns and light creams. They also come with fireplaces that can provide warmth as well as an interlude of romance on nights with a northern chill. A second resort that has adopted the safari-inspired theme is Pai Island (www. paiisland.com), which also features a raw artistic allure set on a cascading stream in the serene alpine valley. With only ten villas, each guest's privacy is virtually assured. While lush and colorful gardens are dotted with beautiful sculptures, each of the villas seems like a private gallery in itself, decorated with the carved exotic wood furniture and masterpieces of cel-

Taking the twisting and undulating mountain highway to the east brings you to Chiang Mai, the former capital of the northern Lanna kingdom with its ancient walls, temples and spires. But not all the stupas are old and historical; there is one that blends northern Thai nostalgia with Asian minimalism, The Chedi Chiang Mai (www.ghmhotels.com), a Zen-like retreat set on the banks of the Ping River, featuring the Chedi Club Suites with their own private courtyards and balconies geared for discerning guests with a penchant for discreet service, whether dining indoors or al fresco. Their décor is understated, almost like a zen-do, using teak and terrazo, rattan, cottons and silks in primary blacks and browns with contrasting tones of taupe and fawn.













by the Buddhist mythical Himmaphan forest with its canopy formed by rain trees, a shimmering lotus pond and fragrant frangipani. Interspersed and connected in this luxurious palace setting are six private sleeping pavilions as well as open-air salas, three gorgeous swimming pools, private Jacuzzis and saunas. Each high ceiling sala features handcrafted details, plush furnishings and rare artifacts in different color schemes that range from vibrant reds and shimmering golds to ebony blacks and rich silvers to complete the priceless ambience.

Outside Bangkok, in the mountainous northern reaches of Chiang Mai, Veranda Chiang Mai - The High Resort (www. verandaresortandspa.com/chiangmai) is a total Zen experience in a five-star setting from the moment of arrival. In Chiang Mai's fertile Mae Rim Valley, In contrast, Four Seasons Resort, Chiang Mai (www.fourseasons.com/chiangmai) features three- and four-story palatial Resident Villas, recreations of traditional Thai-Burmese architecture, each with gabled buttresses and polished teak floors, the 3- and 4-bedroom homes feature open-plan living and dining spaces with a fireplace and wine cellar, as well as private pool, sundecks and verandas.



Meanwhile, for those who want to feel closer to their surroundings, further to the east, Chiang Rai, the sister hotel of the Four Seasons Resort, Chiang Mai, Four Seasons Tented Camp, Golden Triangle (www.fourseasons.com/goldentriangle) is ideal. Set amid exotic bamboo groves, guests are treated to an echo of the romantic spirit of the 19-century explorers, and with just 15 accommodations, spaced at comfortable distances from each other on a trail overlooking the Ruak River in Myanmar, guests feel as if they are our there alone, protected by the majestic peaks. Each tent has been designed as an open space that flows into the large exterior wooden deck. Furnish-

ings are all handcrafted including a handhammered copper bathtub reminiscent of the past. Dining and drinks, including house wines and spirits is all part of the package that includes mahout training and elephant trekking.

From the north, we travel south to the acclaimed pristine Thai beaches, beginning at the eastern tip of the Thai Gulf coast. Here, tucked away on an isolated island is Soneva Kiri by Six Senses (www.sixsenses.com/soneva-kiri). After an hour's flight on a private plane from Bangkok to the island's airport, guests are met by their Mr. (or Ms.) Friday and then whisked away on a five-minute Aquaessense powerboat crossing to this luxury retreat. Described as 'Intelligent Luxury' and 'guilt-free hedonism', the resort's goal is to help you return your body and mind to the 'slow life'. Simple, yet sophisticated, the resort stresses ecological sustainable design concepts using local materials as much as possible to protect and preserve this tropical haven as well as our planet.

Much closer to Bangkok is the Royal beachside resort of Hua Hin, which came to notice in 1926, when King Rama VI

constructed his golden teak Royal residence, Klai Kangwon. V Villas Hua Hin (www.v-villashuahin.com) marks another era in the beachside town's evolution. Inspired by terraced rice paddy patterns and European villazzos, V Villas offers a sophisticated, contemporary holiday lifestyle. The finest of its accommodations is the visually intriguing two-story Presidential Beachfront Villa. Within its symmetry of bold lines and natural elements, guests are left alone to bask in contemporary and luxurious comforts. The airy living and dining areas open to a spacious terrace with private swimming pool enshrouded by lush tropical vegetation with the white beach and aqua seas just beyond. InterContinental Hua Hin Resort (www.intercontinental. com/huahin) has gone one step further in opulent beachfront private sanctuaries with its La Residence Royale Hua Hin. Influenced by the 19th century designs of the Hua Hin Summer Palace built by King Rama VI, this Thai home and enclave is a stunning testament to Thailand's Royal heritage and unsurpassed luxury. Set on half an acre personifying seclusion and regal living, the home features two lavish bedrooms with en suite marble bathrooms as well as spacious living and







dining areas, a lush garden, infinity pool and full-time, live-in butler. For those who love to be pampered, The Grand Rest Pavilion packages offered at Rest **Detail Hotel** (www.restdetailhotel.com) are an indulgent hedonist delight. While enjoying the luxuries of an expansive 4bedroom beachfront home with oversized living and dining areas, a private swimming pool and waterfall, guests are also treated to daily champagne breakfasts as well as a selection of hors d'oeuvres served daily the Pavilion Master as well as evening seafood barbecue. One Hua Hin resort that has received such accolades as Gold Nugget Award Winner for Best Architectural Design 2008, Gold Class Winner for Green Hotel 2009 and most recently, the 8th Thailand Tourism Awards 2010 is Asara Villa and Suite (www.asaravillaandsuite.com), featuring its one-of-a-kind master beachside retreat, The Presidential Villa. Fronting its own private beach area with its signature floating daybed where guests love to wile away the hours, the villa contains three separate sumptuous pavilions including a master bedroom pavilion, a family/ guest room pavilion, and an open-air



About 700 kilometers south of Bangkok is Thailand's third largest island Ko Samui, offering a host of luxurious pleasures. At the apex of getaways is Sanctuary Pool Villa at Banyan Tree Samui (www.banyantree.com/en/samui) that combines the best elements of a tropical retreat. A stunning central Thai-style sala serves as the hub for two one-bedroom bungalows, each with private pool. 

A veritable oasis in the heart of Samui's bustling Chaweng Beach is The Library (www. library.com), a hip, chic, boutique resort with panache. exceptional location on the 3-kilometer powdery white Laem Yai Beach, ranked number 2 for beauty, and number 1 for tranquility. The Pool Villa with Ocean Front offers this as well as very stylish amenities like Thai cotton bed linens and duvets, relaxing spa tub en suite with the master bedroom and a spacious balcony always filled with fresh colorful flowers providing breathtaking panoramic ocean vistas. The Thai-style Melati Beach Resort and Spa (www.melatiresort.com) Presidential Suites with their harmonized blend of chic and Feng Shui elements surpass all expectations. A perfect harmony has been created between the pristine seaside, manicured tropical gardens and luxurious décor, particularly with the master bedroom enjoying direct access to the Jacuzzi swimming pool, deck and sala as well as two outdoor tubs nestled into the lush greenery. And when the sounds and scenes of nature's performance aren't enough, there is a state-of-the-art home theater for your entertainment. Pavilion Samui Boutique Resort (www. pavilionsamui.com) has been designed to accommodate everyone's tastes when it comes to relaxing, rejuvenating or playing in different waters. Among the various luxurious Modern Thai accommodations are one that come with an exclusive Jacuzzi spa with or without plunge pool, or there are the Hydro Pool Villas secluded in thick tropical flora and beachfront Grand Pool Villas with a private infin-

Set on the island's most beautiful stone beach, Laem Nan, Silavadee Pool **Spa Resort** (www.silavadeeresort.com) which literally means "Beautiful Rock" is becoming one of Samui's most exclusive hideaways. With each villa providing such indulgent amenities as a private pool with an Aqua Jet Massage Bed, it should come as no surprise that this resort has already received numerous honors and accolades such as the 2010 Traveler's Choice Award and the Dream Resort Thailand Award and World Luxury Hotel Award in 2009. Located in Bo Phut, every accommodation at Hansar Samui (www. hansarsamui.com) is treated to the most spectacular world famous sunsets and views of the sea and neighboring Koh Pha Ngam. Simple yet sumptuous, the rooms oversized and designed with an open floor plan, feature original custom hand-made furnishings that include a delicious feather bed with down comforter and pillows as well as freestanding bathtubs and full-size walk-in rain showers that harmonize perfectly with the beach and lush tropical surroundings. Another


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
exclusive resort on Lamai beach is the Langham Place Samui at Lamai Beach (www.kohsamui.langhamplacehotels.com) that combines local Thai aesthetics with high-end amenities that begin with a walkway of waterfalls and the serenade of 'cool vibes' set by the resident DJ. Nestled on the beachfront amidst lush and fragrant foliage, the lavish accommodations include a variety of woods, soft silks and natural cottons. Meanwhile, for a contrast from the tropical delights, the premier Ocean View Pool Villas feature Tivoli music systems and in addition to beachfront pools. Completing a circuit of the island and we come to Napasai (www.napasai.com) set in a grove of cashew trees on the north coast. Preeminent among the resort's selection of luxury accommodations is its private Maenam Beach front Pool Residence. Built into the cliff side, this large Thai contemporary multi-level home includes its own swimming pool with poolside sala (Thai pavilion). Each bedroom with en suite bathroom also enjoys its own entrance from a main stairway leading to and from the beach.

Just across a causeway to the south is the island of Phuket, often referred to as the "Pearl of the Andaman. Once known for its tin mining, Indigo Pearl (www.indigo-pearl.com) and its Bill Bensley Shell Suite pays homage to both the island's rich history and natural resources in addition to the world-renowned architect and designer. The accommodation is a bold statement in raw sensuality and industrial chic mixing rough timber and rivets with shimmering silks, punctuated by striking objects d'art, some framing the private pool. Nestled on a lush hillside halfway down the island's west coast fringing Pansea Beach we find Amanpuri Phuket (www.amanresorts.com/amanpuri) and its much raved about beachfront Pavilion 105. Aman in Sanskrit means peace and this spectacular Thai contemporary











home resonates with the sounds of soothing tranquility with the sea, sand, sun and breezes. Its very comforting decor incorporates golden teak woodwork and furniture with stone, marble and natural fabrics, creating an ambience of serene elegance for a perfect haven. At the southern-eastern tip of the island we find Sri Panwa Phuket (www.sripanwa. com) perched atop Cape Panwa and commanding breathtaking views of the Aqua and indigo Andaman and its many priceless emerald and ivory islands. Voted as one of the 100 Luxury Hotets around the globe by Best Hotels magazine and an Overnight Sensatons 2010 by Kiwi Collection as Well as Best Resort in the Most Natural Environment by Art Travel Volume II, the very private accommodations nestled amidst the 40 acres of island greenery offer an oasis of calm amidst the infinite horizons.


There is no shortage of extraordinary hotels in and near Phuket, including Banvan Tree Phuket (www.banyantree. com/phuket) with its sumptuous Doublepool Villas, Twinpalms (www.twinpalmsphuket.com)and their tony private yacht and a short boat ride to the exquisite Six Senses Yao Noi (www.sixsenses. com/SixSensesYaoNoi). Well-heeled travelers occasionally decide to invest in a holiday home in Phuket, enjoying all the comforts of a five-star resorts. They can buy homes or properties that can be leased and managed in their absence, such as the aforementioned Amanpuri and **Baan Yamu** (www.baanyamu.com) by the brains behind Twinpalms.

Across the mountainous isthmus is the Andaman coast and the province of Phang-nga with its lofty jungle clad peaks surrounding 11-kilometer pearl white Khao Lak beach where The **Sarojin** (www.sarojin.com) is ensconced in tropical flora, ideal for a romantic interlude, which is just what this resort caters to. Each residence includes an intimate couple's bath and rain shower in a private garden with sala and terrace. With the aid of an "imagineer", ultimate personal concierge, lovers can delight in creating 'just for two' bespoke adventures cruising the sea or exploring the jungle.



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






Just south of Phuket is the province of Krabi, Phulay Bay, A Ritz-Carlton Reserve (http://reserve.ritzcarlton. com/phulay_bay), and among its pavilions and villas are the breathtaking Royal Beach Villas, two of which feature outdoor Roman-style bathtubs as well as rainforest showers. Their interiors are airy and immaculate, featuring a lavish, contemporary Thai ambience that evokes a sense of hedonistic indulgence, further enhanced by the private garden with veranda and infinity plunge pool with hydrojets. The bedrooms are just as inviting with their exquisite furnishings including an oversized bed with deep, dense, feather mattresses for dreaming to the serenades of wind and wave. The living room and dining area, done in local materials and relaxing, demure tones, open out to a fabulous private pool with the sun drenched powdery white sands and aqua seas just a further few steps away.

Just across the channel is the island of Pha-ngan, renowned for its monthly Full Moon Party that draws revelers from both near and afar. But if one is searching for seclusion and the grandeur of the Thai Kingdom during the reign of Rama V, Santhiya Royal Pool Villa Suite at Santhiya Resort & Spa (www.santhiya.com) is like no other. Enveloped by semi-wild lush local flora, this sensuous eco-chic teak hideaway that includes a rock garden and romantic pools resounds silently with its contemporary luxuries and colonial splendors, except for the sounds of wind, waves and the serenade of birds and nature.



When it comes to cuisine, there is no place on earth where you can find the combination of variety, value, and excellence that is present in Thailand. All of the senses are fully engaged while dining in Thailand, accompanied by the warm and attentive service that is just as widely renowned as the delicious cuisine.



Many food connoisseurs come expressly to enjoy Thai cuisine, and there is no shortage of truly excellent restaurants proudly representing the local gastronomical culture, starting with the regal Blue Elephant (www.blueelephant. com/bangkok) restaurant and cooking school, which sits in a beautifully renovated turn-of-the-century teak building. The decor exudes authentic charm, as Thai cultural dancers in traditional dress entertain guests as they enjoy Royal Thai classical dishes, Northern or Northeastern style favorites, as well as desserts and intricately carved fruits, each beautifully presented in accordance with time-honored Thai gastronomic traditions. While traditional Thai cuisine is usually served family-style, there has been a growing movement to elevate the experience to fine dining. At bo.lan (www.bolan. co.th), the chefs meticulously comb Thai fresh markets every day for the finest ingredients from around Thailand, and then cook everything on a slow food basis, creating a kaleidoscope of flavors, colors, and textures presented as edible works of art. Try the prix fixe menu for a majestic tasting journey; reservations are highly recommended. Another splendid example of Michelin-starred haute Thai cuisine can be found in Bangkok at the Siam Kempinski, where the team behind Kiin Kiin in Copenhagen, Sweden have opened Sra Bua (www.kempinski. com/en/bangkok), a stunningly inspired setting with warm woods and the suggestion of a rice paddy. Here, modern interpretations of authentic Thai flavors come to the table in exquisite presentations, such as the 15-course tasting menu which interprets a wide range of regional Thai favorites.

impeccable tastes

If on the subject of marvelous settings, then Tables (www.bangkok.grand.hyatt. com), the brainchild of world renowned designer Tony Chi, must be mentioned, as it has fast become a sought-after dining adventure. The interior décor and gastronomy brings to mind the nostalgia of Classical European Cuisine, with the novelty of Tableside Cooking on five exclusively designed cooking stations. Here, chefs come out of the kitchen and cook at your tableside for a sense of flair and entertainment. Two private dining rooms, decked out in vintage style, are also equipped with their own cooking stations.

For a completely different atmosphere, there is the dining with a view at Red **Sky** (www.centarahotelsresorts.com), on the 55th floor of the Centara Grand Bangkok. The Urban Bistro offerings here range from steak and veal to salmon, lobster and mussels, while the Wine Bar has a massive selection of excellent wines available by the glass. Inside the two-story glass-walled Wine Cellar, a Wine Angel uses a harness to gracefully retrieve bottles ordered by diners. Enjoy a post-dinner cocktail at the Martini Bar, where the view and libations will leave you stirred, not shaken. Another of Bangkok's elevated alfresco dining highlights is Breeze (www.lebua.com), appropriately named as it is located sky-high on the 52nd floor of State Tower. Here, award-winning Consultant Chef Sam Leong and Executive Chef James Ho have combined their vast experiences to deliver the finest Asian seafood and barbeque imaginable. At Breeze, is hard to say what is more of a marvel, the perfectly prepared giant scallops and succulent lobsters, or the view from the soaring glass skybridge. Afterwards, stay on for a cocktail or move up to the mesmerizing rooftop Sky Bar at Sirocco (www.lebua.com).

















In vivid contrast, there is the achingly stylish Long Table (www.longtablebangkok.com), a haute sky dining destination brought to you by the geniuses behind the world-famous Bed Supperclub. A breezy 25th floor above central Bangkok, the bold and beautiful clientele congregate here around Japanese-style sofas to sip on delectable cocktails and dine on traditional Thai cuisine with a twist. The centerpiece of the restaurant is the eponymous extended dining table, big enough for you and sixty of your closest (and chicest) friends. Another sky-high dining experience in Bangkok is SkyDine Design on 25 (www.siamatsiam.com/restaurant) on the 25th floor of Siam@Siam Design Hotel & Spa, which dazzles with breathtaking 360-degree panoramic views of Bangkok. The restaurants on this floor are La Vue French and Mediterranean Restaurant, The Roof Restaurant and The Roof Champagne and Wine Bar.

Vertiginous feasts can be found in many places around Thailand. One extraordinary experience is on the tropical island of Ko Samui. **Dining on the Rocks** (www.sixsenses.com/sixsensessamui) offers what might be the most incredible setting for a restaurant anywhere in the world. It is perched on interconnected wooden platforms boldly jutting out high

over a seaside cliff, as the strains of soft jazz music interplay with the waves crashing into giant boulders far below. Arrive at dusk for the indescribably breathtaking sunset vista, and stay for the whimsically creative flavors of New Asian Cuisine.

Seemingly every style of international fare is well represented in Bangkok, which boasts a plethora of Chinese restaurants. The modern and stylish Fei Ya (www.marriott.com/hotels/travel/bkkbr-renaissance-bangkok-ratchaprasong-hotel), has fast become a most preferred venue among aficionados of Chinese cuisine for auspicious gatherings and to entertain special guests. Its name translating to "flying duck," and the focus here is on crispy, juicy, roasted Peking duck and Cantonese Chinese dishes like tender Char Sui pork. A tea bar stocks more than 30 varieties of the most exquisite and valuable teas anywhere. And for superb Japanese gastronomy, Tsu and Nami (www.marriott.com/hotels/travel/bkkdt-jw-marriott-hotel-bangkok/ are actually two stylish restaurants in one on the lower level of the JW Marriott: Tsu offers traditional Japanese cuisine, while Nami is a teppanyaki style establishment where a skilled chef grills food right in front of diners with panache.

There are some excellent French restaurants to choose from in Bangkok, and arguably the finest such purveyor in town is **Bonjour** (www.bonjourbangkok.com), housed in a charmingly restored royal mansion. Bonjour prides itself on using authentic French products and recipes. In fact, most of the meticulously selected ingredients are imported from France, under the supervision of owner Xavier Bruzaud-Grille and prepared by executive chef Thierry Enderlin. The menu is not huge, as the focus is on quality preparations, but the wine list is wonderfully wide-ranging.

Outside of Bangkok, seemingly another world away within the Lannastyle house in the verdant mountains of Chiang Mai, Farang Ses (www. mandarinoriental.com/chiangmai) offers an elegant incarnation of traditional countryside French dishes such as lamb and rabbit in a sumptuous setting of wrought chandeliers, vaulted ceilings and bronze columns. The wine cellar here boasts over 300 vintages, including the most superb champagnes. Those who wish to enjoy a wondrous mountainous backdrop can opt to dine in the breezy alfresco dining area.

Thailand's culinary attractions greatly contribute to the local tourism industry, and outstanding celebrations have emerged as a result. The World Gourmet Festival (www. fourseasons.com/bangkok/world_ gourmet_festival), held annually at Four Seasons Hotel Bangkok in September, brings world renowned chefs from across the globe to one venue for an extraordinary week of epicurean inspiration. And for one night each year, the Bangkok Chefs Charity Gala Dinner & Auction is one of the most talked-about events in town, a gala dinner with a special menu prepared by executive chefs from leading hotels in Bangkok and Phuket held annually in the Grand Ballroom of the Mandarin Oriental Bangkok. And the best part, all funds raised from this ritzy culinary event go exclusively to charity. Now that's luxury with a heart.


