Trat A small province at the eastern-most frontier bordering on Cambodia with the Khao Banthat mountain range forming a natural demarcation, Trat is a resort town with over fifty large and small off-shore islands, long white sandy beaches and unspoiled coral ranges. It is also a major fruit-growing and fishing area.

About 315 kilometres from Bangkok and covering an area of 2,819 square kilometres, the province is administratively divided into the districts of Mueang Trat, Khao Saming, Laem Ngop, Khlong Yai and Bo Rai, and the sub-districts of Ko Chang and Ko Kut.

History

Trat is a seaport mostly suitable for mooring ships, loading goods, trade exchange, refilling food and freshwater for ships. It is therefore a community site of Chinese merchants who travelled to trade.

Trat was considered among the trade centre cities of Southeast Asia in the late Ayutthaya period. A lot of goods that were sent to sell overseas, especially forest things; such as, deer's horns, animal hides, scented wood, and spices, were brought from the forest and mountainous zone of the eastern coast including Rayong, Chanthaburi, and Trat. Such goods were carried by river and along the Khao Saming Mountain to reach the mouth of the Gulf of Trat.

In the independence war, King Taksin the Great chose Trat as a bumper outpost to provide food for the troops before he moved the naval army from Chanthaburi.

In the reign of King Rama I the Great, Trat was still an important seaport, as it used to be in the Ayutthaya period. During the reign of King Rama III, Thailand fought in a war with Chao Anuwong, the ruler of Vientiane, who later took sides with Vietnam. Thailand and Vietnam were in conflict and a war broke out in 1828. Trat was a site of gathering soldiers and food, and a military fortress and camp was established at Ban Laem Hin in the Gulf of Trat.

In the reign of King Rama V the Great, France sent its naval troops to seize Chanthaburi in 1893 (Ro So 112), and returned it to Thailand in 1904 in exchange for Trat, covering from Laem Sing to Ko Kut, and Patchantakhirikhet (Ko Kong). Later, the Thai government came to realise that Trat was of strategic importance, and that most of the people there were Thai. However, with the intelligence of King Rama V the Great, France agreed to make a contract to return Trat and Dan Sai on the right bank of the Mekong River (when facing the mouth of the river) to Thailand in exchange for Battambang, Siem Reap, and Sri Sophon, on 23 March, 1906. The handover ceremony was performed by Phraya Maha Ammattayathipbodi, then Phraya Si Thep who held the position of Palat Thunchalong or Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Interior, as the head of the delegation of the Thai government, and Monsieur Rousseau Residant as the head of the delegation of the French government at the Trat Provincial Hall, and the French troops were withdrawn on 6 July, 1907.

During the Indochina War (1940-1941), France attempted to seize Trat again on 17 January, 1941, but the Thai navy fought

back courageously to successfully save this strategic city of abundance.

In 1978, there was a war in Cambodia, and a hundred thousand Khmers fled for their lives into Thailand through the Banthat Mountain Range, an eastern border. Highway 318 running parallel with the Banthat Mountain Range and the coastal line towards Amphoe Khlong Yai became a main strategic route. The war continued until 1986. After that, the path was transformed into a border trade route between Cambodia and Thailand, with the Hat Lek Border Market ending the boundary of Thailand and marking the starting point of travel to Ko Kong.

The discovery of “red gems” or “Siamese rubies” in the area of Amphoe Bo Rai in 1971 caused a gems fever and people from all walks of life flocked here to try their luck. Prosperity in all aspects happened in Bo Rai and made it a big city being developed alongside with the town of Trat. Its former dense forest area became pitted, and when all precious stones were gone in 1991, Bo Rai was left a deserted city with only shops and buildings as a reminder of its flourishing economy in the past.

HOW TO GET THERE

By Car : From Bangkok, take one of these three routes:

1. Motorway : Start at Km 0 at the Sri Nagarind-Ramkhamhaeng Intersection and drive onto the route Ban Bueng-Klaeng-Chanthaburi-Trat, a total distance of approximately 315 Kilometres
2. Bang Na-Chon Buri-Klaeng-Chanthaburi-Trat (Highway 344), a distance of approximately 318 Kilometres
3. Bang Na-Trat (Highway 3) passing Chon Buri-Rayong-Chanthaburi-Trat, a total distance of approximately 385 Kilometres

Travel to Nearby Provinces

Trat - Chanthaburi

By bus : A regular bus service is available at the Trat Provincial Bus Terminal in Tambon Wang Krachae, Amphoe Mueang Trat. It takes around 1.15 hours. The privately-owned bus operators include :

By Commuter Van : A daily commuter van service is available at the Trat Provincial Bus Terminal in Tambon Wang Krachae, Amphoe Mueang Trat, during 05.00 a.m. - 07.00 p.m. It takes around 1 hour, and requires a full van of 11 passengers to start the journey. The fare is about 70 Baht/person.

Local Transport

Trat-Khlong Yai : The total distance is 75 Kilometres. A Song Thaeo minibus departs from the back of the Municipal Market during 06.00 a.m. - 06.00 p.m. The fare is about 100 Baht. From Khlong Yai to Ban Hat Lek, The fare is 30 Baht.

Trat-Ban Hat Lek : The total distance is 110 Kilometres. A commuter van departs from the Trat Provincial Bus Terminal during 06.00 a.m. - 06.00 p.m. The fare is about 110 Baht.

Trat- Laem Ngop (Song Thaeo minibus), a distance of 17 Kilometres, leaving the Trat Municipal Market from 06.00 a.m. - 06.00 p.m. onward. The fare is 50 Baht.

Trat-Laem Sok (Song Thaeo minibus), a distance of 28 Kilometres, leaving the Trat Municipal Market during 08.00 a.m. - 01.00 p.m. The fare is 70 Baht.

Trat- Khao Saming-Bo Rai, a distance of 53 Kilometres, leaving the Trat Municipal Market during 08.00 - 12.00 a.m. The fare is 60 Baht.

Trat-Khao Saming-Saen Tung-Tha Chot, a distance of 28 Kilometres, leaving the Trat Municipal Market during 06.00 a.m. - 05.30 p.m. The fare is 50 Baht.

In general, there is a minibus service from the town of Trat to other districts. The minibus departs from the Municipal Market. **After 07.00 p.m., tourists are required to take a charter service of which the fare is fairly agreed before the journey.** For further details, contact Tel. 0 3951 2128, 08 6145 4442.

ATTRACTIONS

Amphoe Mueang Trat

Wat Buppharam (วัดบุปผาราม) or Wat Plai Khlong

(วัดปลายคลอง) located on Phatthanakan Plai Khlong Road, Mu 3 Ban Plai Khlong, Tambon Wang Krachae. is the most ancient temple in Trat. **It won the award for conservation of Thai architecture in 2001 from the Association of Siamese Architects.** It is the province's oldest temple built around the reign of King Prasat Thong (1648 A.D.) in the Ayutthaya Period. Than Phrakhru Khunnasanphisut (Luangpho Ho), an abbot during the reign of King Rama V the Great, restored the monk's dwelling and permanent objects in the temple. Presently, Than Phrakhru Suwannasanwibun has established a museum, with full cooperation and support from the villagers, and kept the temple compound clean and tidy. Thus, the temple has become the centre for religious affairs. Places of interest within the temple include :

Museum of priceless ancient objects: HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn graciously presided over the opening ceremony on 29 April, 1992. Many ancient objects have been collected here; such as, Lord Buddha's relics which are the country's most auspicious item of respect, a golden Buddha image lined with silver, Buddha images in different postures, Chinese ceramics, European crockery, a kettledrum, etc. This is evidence of an exchange of culture between this seaport on this eastern coast and those in Southeast Asia and the Western sphere. The Museum is open daily from 08.00 a.m. - 05.00 p.m.

Mural Paintings in the Ubosot (ordination hall) and the reclining Buddha image hall were drawn by local artists in the Rattanakosin era. They are a combination of Chinese arts and literature, which shows that this temple might have been favoured by Chinese merchants on their trips to the eastern coast. There were Chinese traders having migrated by boat to Trat since the Ayutthaya period. Some came from Ayutthaya and Bangkok, and the others from Vietnam, Malaysia, and Singapore.

Group of Thai-style Monk's Cells were correctly constructed according to the code of monastic discipline that restricts its size for only one monk. The locals would help build a monk's cell for the boy to be ordained and carry it to the temple on the ordination day.

Chanting Hall is a wooden pavilion on stilts, having a one-tiered enameled brick roof, extended "Pik Nok" eaves, a gable of gilded carved-wood in the Thep Phanom (angel in adoration) pattern, "Pakon" paneled walls, and octagonal wooden poles. Chedi is a square pagoda with 12 indented corners made of cement-coated laterite.

Wihan Fa Kradan is an image hall on a junk-shaped brick base, the same as that of the Ubosot, built in the late Ayutthaya period. It has a one-tiered roof and wooden walls.

Recommended activity : Pay homage to the Luangpho To Buddha image, Thai-style monk's and visit the museum of historical ancient objects.

To get there: From Bangkok, take Highway 3 (Sukhumvit) to the town of Trat, pass the Municipal Fresh Market, and turn right at the traffic light intersection (Yaek Lak Mueang). Then, pass



the City Pillar Shrine and turn right at the T-junction in front of Wat Yotha Nimit. Go straight ahead for about 20 metres and turn left at the T-junction. Drive on for about 1.5 kilometres and see the temple's entrance on the hill on the right-hand side.

For more information, contact Tel. 0 3951 2636.

Wat Yotha Nimit (วัดโยธานิมิตร) also known as **Wat Bot** (วัดโบสถ์) is situated on Thetsaban 4 Road at the junction near the City Pillar Shrine. It is the only royal temple in Trat, which was built in the reign of King Taksin the Great when he was gathering his troops in order to liberate the country from Burma's control. The construction was finished in the reign of King Rama III. The temple was once used as a place to hold the

oath of allegiance ceremony by government officials since the reign of King Taksin until King Rama V, when the place to hold the ceremony was changed to Wat Phai Lom.

There is an old ordination hall of Ayutthaya art, containing murals which depict the Vessantara Jataka. At present, it serves as a Wihan called *Wihan Yotha Nimit* for storing many antiques such as palm-leaved books, scriptures for sermons and the Lord Buddha's footprint. This Wihan was last renovated in 1975. They repaired the roof, columns, doors, windows and outer wall but their old forms still remained.

Recommended activity: Visit the Wihan or old image hall built in the reign of King Taksin the Great, and pay homage to the

wooden Buddha image and the Shrine of King Taksin the Great.

To get there : From Bangkok, take Highway 3 (Sukhumvit Road) to reach the town of Trat, and pass the Municipal Fresh Market. Then, turn right at the traffic light intersection (Yaek Lak Mueang) to pass the City Pillar Shrine. Next, the temple entrance will be easily noticed.

For more information, contact Tel. 0 3951 1218, 0 3952 5491.

City Pillar Shrine (ศาลเจ้าพ่อหลักเมือง) is located on Lak Mueang Road near Wat Yotha Nimit. It is different from other city pillar shrines because of its form as a Chinese pavilion. When King Taksin came to gather troops here, he ordered to build this city pillar which was believed by the Chinese to protect the city from enemies and to bring peace to the people. Therefore, the city pillar was a symbol to maintain a good relationship between the Thais and Chinese. Every year on the sixth night of the waxing moon period of the sixth lunar month, there is a celebration called, Phli Mueang Day (วันงานพลีเมือง) or known among the Chinese as Xia Gong Sae Yit (วันเซี่ยงงแซยิด) which means the birthday of the City Pillar God. There are many activities such as Thai alms-giving and Chinese Pung Tao Ma annual fair during a month before and after Chinese New Year.

It is said when France colonized Trat, French soldiers saw people in Trat going to pay homage to the city pillar everyday, so they wanted to pull the pillar down but could not. Although they used an elephant to pull it, it moved just a little. Then the Trat people helped together to renovate and maintain the pillar.

Recommended activity : Pay homage to the City Pillar Shrine to be blessed with auspiciousness for your tour of Trat.

To get there : From Bangkok, take Highway 3 (Sukhumvit Road) to reach the town of Trat, and pass the Municipal Fresh Market. Then, turn right at the traffic light intersection (Yaek Lak Mueang). The entrance to the Shrine is on the left-hand side.

Wat Phai Lom (วัดไผ่ล้อม) located on Lak Mueang Road and has played an important role in the province's education. It used to be a resident of Trat's Father of Education-Than Chaokhun Phra Wimonmethachan Worayannurak. The temple also houses a Buddhist garden for public meditation and Chedi museum of

three much revered monks of Trat. Its devout monks as well as novices have helped to enhance faith among the villagers and made the temple an always reliable place for them.

Recommended activity : Visit the Than Chaokhun Wimon Methachan (Chaeng Chanthasaro) Museum, study Lord Buddha's dharma on Sundays, and feed fish at the Phutthatham Garden.

To get there : From Bangkok, take Highway 3 to reach the town of Trat, and pass the Municipal Fresh Market. Then, turn left at the traffic light intersection and go on for approximately one kilometre to see the temple's entrance.

Residang Kampot Ancient Monument (โบราณสถานจวนเรสิดัง กัมปอร์ต) is located on Lak Mueang Road, Tambon Nai Mueang. It is a 3-storey half-brick half-wood building having an extended hip roof. It used to be a residence of the French commissioner who was assigned by the French government to rule Trat during 1910-1921. It was used as a provincial governor's residence during 1907-1928. At present, it is an office buildings of the Probation Office, Department of Corrections/Probation, but still remains in the original style and architecture. Visitors are welcomed on official days during official hours.

Recommended activity : Admire the ancient building and its architectural style.

To get there : From Bangkok, follow Highway 3 to reach the town of Trat, pass the Municipal Fresh Market, and turn left at the traffic light intersection. Then go straight ahead for around 600 metres and see the entrance on the left-hand side.

Wat Khiri Wihan (วัดคีรีวิหาร) formerly known as **Wat Tha Luean** (วัดท่าเลื้อน) or **Wat Phukhao Yuan** (วัดภูเขายวน) an old temple of over 110 years old located at Ban Tha Luean on a mountain overlooking forested hills and sea. Having undergone restoration to look like a brand new temple, it also houses a small teak forest, which lends a shady and serene atmosphere. It is remarkable for its beautiful architecture with a mixture of modern arts. The important religious places in the temple compound include the large Ubosot or ordination hall, Chedi, reception house of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn, Thamma Sara Uthit and Niramit

Samakkhi monk's cells, preaching hall, and the Chinese image hall housing Phra Phuttha Udom Sombun, Phra Awalokitesuan (Avalokitesvara), and Phra Sangkatchai.

To get there : From the town of Trat, follow Highway 3 on the Trat-Khlong Yai-Ban Hat Lek route for approximately 20 kilometres., and see the temple entrance on the left-hand side. For more information, contact Tel. 0 3950 1129, 08 9936 0273.

Irrawaddy Dolphins Viewpoint (จุดชมโลมาอิรวดี) is located at Mu 4, Tambon Laem Klat. Irrawaddy or Ayeyarwaddy dolphins have a scientific name "Orcaella brevirostris" in the family "Delphinidae". The distinguished feature is their round head that looks like a monk's alms bowl or "Bat", so they are called "Loma Hua Bat" in Thailand. They are dark grey, but some are light grey, with small eyes, a mouth in the lower part, body fins spreading in a triangle shape, and tiny upper fins that are flat and thin, similar to a scythe, and measuring around 180-275 cm. long. There is no report of their weight. They live in the Pacific Ocean, Indian Ocean, and the Gulf of Thailand, and are often found in brackish water sources and lakes like in the river mouth. Some schools of them may live in mighty rivers; such as, the Mekong River and Tonle Sap Lake. In 1916, they were also found in the Chao Phraya River.

In Southeast Asia, Irrawaddy dolphins were first found in the Irrawaddy River in Myanmar and they were named after the river. The dolphins can also be found in other sites; such as, Chilka Lake in India, the Mekong River, Songkhla Lake, and in the estuary of the Bang Pakong River, etc. Other names of the dolphins include "Loma Hua Bat Mi Khrip Lang," "Loma Nam Chuet," "Loma Hua Mon" in southern dialect, "Pla Kha" in Lao, etc. The dolphins in Tambon Laem Klat can be seen during November and the beginning of March. A 15 minute boat ride from shore will take tourists to closely watch swimming dolphins eating mackerels, a familiar scene for the local fishermen but an impressive one for the tourists.

Recommended activity : Take a boat cruise to see the dolphins in Tambon Laem Klat. Tourists can contact the Laem Klat Sub-district Administration Organisation for the service.

To get there : From Bangkok, after crossing the bridge over the Welu River, drive on and before reaching the town, turn

left at the traffic light junction towards Amphoe Khlong Yai. Then, go straight ahead for about 35 Kilometres, and turn right to the Laem Klat Sub-district Administration Organisation.

For more information, contact the Laem Klat Sub-district Administration Organisation at Tel. 0 3958 4233.

1st Mangrove Forest Learning and Development

Centre (ศูนย์ส่งเสริมการเรียนรู้และพัฒนาทรัพยากรป่าชายเลนที่ ๑) is located by the Trat River at 539 Mu 8, Tambon Wang Krachae. The Centre is responsible for the promotion of public learning, transfer of technology to the public, communities, and schools; cooperation with other government agencies, relevant bodies in the local and private sectors, and private organisations; preparation of learning courses on mangrove forest resources, diversity, and ways of living of plants and animals at different levels in the mangrove forest; and creation of mangrove forest demonstrative plots for a nature study.

The Centre has a nature study trail along a narrow cement bridge under the canopy of the mangrove forest for a distance of 860 metres. There are more than 40 species of plants for a study. The thickly growing plants found include Kong Kang Bai Yai (*Rhizophora mucronata* Poir) or red mangrove, Kong Kang Bai Lek (*Rhizophora apiculata* Blume), Phangka Hua Sum Dok Daeng (*Bruguiera gymnorhiza*), Khlu (*Pluchea indica*) or Indian marsh fleabane, Pho Thale (*Thespesia populnea*) or Portia tree, Rang Kathae (*Kandelia candel*), Tabun Dam (*Xylocarpus moluccensis*), and Tabun Khao (*Xylocarpus granatum*). Furthermore, lower plants and annuals are also found on tree crotches, like those in the rain forest; such as, Klet Nakkharat (*Lycopodium phlegmaria*) or tassel fern, Kratae Tai Mai (*Drynaria quercifolia*) or oak-leaf fern, Nom Tamlia (*Hoya ovalifolia*) or wax plant, Wai Tamoi (*Dendrobium crumenatum*) or pigeon orchid, and orchids. They will blossom in the rainy season, during October and February, when the sea is at high tide, especially during the 12th waning moon day and the 5th waxing moon day, when the tide is in at daytime. For a visit at this time, the forest can be seen flooded with changes in its natural conditions. For instance, schools of fish come to feed themselves with food in the mangrove forest, and birds, like collared kingfisher, egret, etc, hover to catch fish. Sometimes fruits of the plants in the mangrove forest are carried away

by water, which shows the propagation of the plants in the forest. One part of the trail goes along Khlong Bang Phra, the canal of brackish water where there is an abundance of river shrimp, which is witnessed by a number of giant nets set by the villagers as a trap to catch giant freshwater shrimp swimming to lay eggs at the mouth of the gulf and return to their habitat in the inner part of the river. If going by Noen Ta Maeo Road in front of the Centre at nighttime, visitors will see a number of glittering fireflies amidst darkness, an impressive and beautiful scene.

Recommended activity : Take a boat cruise to see the nature at the mouth of the gulf of Trat, a boat ride to see fireflies at nighttime, and enjoy a nature study trail.

To get there : From Bangkok, take Highway 3 to reach the town of Trat, and pass the Trat Hospital. Then, turn left at the traffic light junction and drive on for about 400 metres. See the traffic light intersection and go directly to pass the Trat Provincial Hall. After that, turn right at the first traffic light intersection and go ahead for about 200 metres. See the left junction to Tratrakarnkhun School and turn left. Go on for about 6 kilometres, and see the Centre's entrance on the left-hand side.

Amphoe Khlong Yai

Hat Sai Ngoen (หาดทรายเงิน) a not-so-wide beach with a pine forest more ideal for relaxing or fishing than swimming. Hat Muk Kaeo is accessible from here.

To get there : Hat Sai Ngoen is at around km. 41 next to Hat Sai Ngam.

Hat Muk Kaeo and Hat Sai Kaeo (หาดมุกแก้วและหาดทรายแก้ว) have a peaceful atmosphere for recreation. Hat Muk Kaeo is a white sandy beach, which lies along from Hat Sai Ngoen to Hat Sai Kaeo, with the shade of pine and coconut trees all along the beach. Visitors can also admire the beautiful sunset here

Hat Sai Ngam (หาดทรายงาม) an approximately 200 metres long white sandy beach running parallel to a grove of pine trees.

To get there : take the same route as Laem Klat at km. 37 and walk across a wooden bridge of some 15 metres long to the beach.

Ratchakarun Thai Red Cross Association's Khao Lan

Center (ศูนย์ราชการุณย์ สภากาชาดไทย เขาล้าน) formerly called the Thai Red Cross Association's Khao Lan Centre, is located on the Trat-Khlong Yai Road, at Km. 48 on the roadside of Highway 318. Her Majesty the Queen ordered to establish the Thai Red Cross Association's Khao Lan Center to help Cambodian refugees. However, the center was closed in 1986 since all the refugees returned to their homeland. In 1992, the Thai Red Cross built the Ratchakarun Hall and the museum to glorify Her Majesty the Queen, President of the Thai Red Cross Association on the occasion of her 60th Birthday Anniversary. The museum is open at 08.30 a.m. - 04.00 p.m. and contains an exhibition concerning H.M. Queen Sirikit's duties and models of Cambodian refugees in many movements, doing their routine activities such as cooking and embroidery. There is also a garden of auspicious trees from 76 provinces, herbal garden, Buddha image in the Sukhothai style in a gesture of subduing Mara, which was built following the command of the Queen for healing Cambodian refugees' painful minds after they escaped from war. It is also a holy place for people in Trat and from other provinces. Behind the museum, there are some peaceful beaches. Accommodation is available for tourists. For further information, please call Tel. 0 3952 1621, 0 3952 1624, 0 3952 1838 Fax. 0 3952 1621 www.redcross.or.th/khaolan, or E-mail : khaolan@tr.ksc.co.th.

Hat Mai Rut (หาดไม้รุต) or **Hat Samran** (หาดสำราญ) turn right off Highway No. 31 between Km. 57–58 toward Ban Mai Rut for 5 Kilometres to end at the concrete bridge. The entrance to the beach is in front of the Community Pavilion or Sala Prachakhom. Walk on another 200 metres to the beach where there is a single bungalow for rent.

Hat Banchuen (หาดบ้านจีน) formerly called **Hat Maro** (หาดมะโร) is located before Amphoe Khlong Yai on Highway 318, between Km. 59 and 60. When getting to the junction, turn right and go on for about 3 Kilometres This beach has delicate sand grain and clear sea water where it is possible to swim. Bangalows for rent are available near the beach.

Thailand's Narrowest Area (ส่วนที่แคบที่สุดในประเทศไทย) located at Mu 2 Ban Khot Sai, Tambon Hat Lek, on the Trat-Khlong Yai route between Km. 81–82. The area is only 450 metres wide.

Ban Hat Lek Border Market (ตลาดขายแดนบ้านหาดเล็ก) a village on the Thai-Cambodian border located at Ban Hat Lek, Tambon Hat Lek, at the very end of Highway No. 31. When fighting in Cambodia was over in 1986, it used to serve as an intermediate marketplace for grain trading between farmers in Cambodia and traders in Ko Kong. The market on the Hat Lek side is open in the morning during 07.00 - 08.30 a.m., selling also inexpensive commodities from Cambodia such as electrical equipment, spectacles, perfume, etc. is open from 07.00 a.m. - 06.30 p.m. Tourists who are interested in duty-free products can take a complimentary daily shuttle commuter van service from here to Ko Kong Resort.

Recommended activity : See goods at the Border Market, cross the border to Ko Kong, a province of Cambodia, explore the way of life of the Khmer people, and buy duty-free products at Ko Kong Resort.

To get there: an hourly van from Trat to Hat Lek is available daily at Bt 110, taking approximately 1½ hours, whereas a taxi trip across the bridge to Ko Kong from the Cambodian side takes about 45 minutes.

Note : Foreigners crossing the border to Cambodia will have to present their passports and visas at Ban Hat Lek border checkpoint, Tel. 0 3958 8084 or at the Cambodian Embassy in Bangkok, Tel. 0 2253 7967, 0 2254 6630.

Amphoe Khao Saming

Wat Mueang Kao Saen Tum (วัดเมืองเก่าแสนตุ่ม) and **Boran Sathan Khao Tomo** (โบราณสถานเขาโต๊ะโมะ) are situated at Mu 7, Ban Irem, Tambon Pranit, approximately 38 Kilometres from the district office of Amphoe Khao Saming. This temple is surrounded by nature, suitable to be a recreational place to relax or to practise meditation.

In the south, you can visit Boran Sathan Khao Tomo which was built before the Buddha's era. It is believed that there is a treasure stored in a hundred thousand jars (Saen Tum) under the ground of this historical site. That is why it is also called Wat Saen Tum. Boran Sathan Khao Tomo is a mound covered with trees and there are dark-brown stone poles in various shapes of angled forms, with a length of 30-150 centimeter, diameter length of 15-20 centimeter and weight of 10-100 kilogram. The way they lay stones over and over is similar to the way the ancient people built a place of worship. Some stones give a bell-like sound when they are knocked.

Amphoe Bo Rai

Gems Markets (ตลาดพลอย) in Amphoe Bo Rai. In the past, Bo Rai was known as the production site of red gems or Siamese rubies. There were interesting gems markets; such as, Talat Phloi Hua Thung, Talat Phloi Ban Sa Yai, Talat Phloi Nong Bon, etc., which were open for trade from the early morning until 10.00 a.m. Nowadays, the gems markets here have the problem of gems sites which are rarely found. Therefore, the gems trade is not as active as before. For tourists who are interested in buying gems or see the conditions of gems markets in general, some are still left to be seen.

Namtok Salatdai (น้ำตกสลัดได) is situated 7 kilometres from Km. 25 of Highway No. 3157 (Saen Tung-Bo Rai). The area rich with natural environment is proper for taking a real rest.

Namtok Khlong Kaeo National Park (อุทยานแห่งชาติน้ำตกคลองแก้ว) has an area of approximately 65,525 rai (104,840 square kilometres). Interesting places to visit are as follows : Namtok Khlong Kaeo, a 7-leveled waterfall where visitors can see the beautiful sight of Bo Rai, especially on the 4th level. Most travellers visit only the 4 lower tiers of the waterfalls because it takes almost all day to climb up to every level. Besides, visitors should also visit Namtok Salat Dai, Namtok Khlong Chai and Pha Lan Hin.

Accommodation : No shelter is available at the park, but tourists can bring their own tents. For more information, please contact the Namtok Khlong Kaeo National Park, Tambon Bo Phloi, Amphoe Bo Rai, Trat 23140. Tel : 0 3952 2039

Admission fees : 200 Baht for adults and 50 Baht for children.

Recommended activity : Enjoy swimming in the ponds on the 1st - 3rd tiers of the waterfall, and join activities around the bonfire.

To get there : From the town of Trat, follow Highway 3 towards Amphoe Khlung for around 17 Kilometres. Arrive in Amphoe Khao Saming and turn right to follow on Highway 3159 for about 27 Kilometres. Turn left to follow on Highway 3157 to reach the 116th Border Patrol Police Company. Then, turn right and drive on for around 8 Kilometres before reaching the Namtok Khlong Kaeo National Park., from Bangkok, take Sukhumvit Road, Highway 3, to Saen Tung Market, Amphoe Khao Saming. Turn left and go along Highway 3157, on the route Saen Tung-Bo Rai for about 33 Kilometres. Turn left and pass the Border Patrol Police Company 116 for another 8 Kilometres to get to Namtok Khlong Kaeo.

Amphoe Laem Ngop

is a beachside district of Trat. It is located approximately 17 kilometres from the town of Trat along Highway 3148 on the Trat-Laem Ngop route. There is a large-scale pier called ***“Tha Thiap Ruea Krachom Fai Laem Ngop”***, which is situated around 500 metres from the Laem Ngop District Office.

Memorial of the Thai Naval Battle at Ko Chang (อนุสรณ์สถานวันวีรกรรมทหารเรือไทยในยุทธนาวีที่เกาะช้าง) is established on the seaside of Laem Ngop. It consists of the Monument of Krommaluang Chumphonkhetudomsak or Prince of Chumphon turning his face to the site of the Ko Chang Naval Battle, and the Museum Building that looks like a battleship. Historical facts on Krommaluang Chumphonkhetudomsak and the Thai naval battle against the French navy are on display inside the Museum. The memorial ground is landscaped as a park. A celebratory fair in memory of the famous battleship is held during 17-21 January of every year.

Recommended activity : Visit the Museum to learn about the historical facts on Krommaluang Chumphonkhetudomsak and the Thai naval battle against the French navy.

To get there : From the town of Trat, take Highway 3148 (Trat-Laem Ngop) for around 16 kilometres and turn right into the lane near the marine police station. Then, drive on for around 500 metres to reach the Memorial.

Ao Tan Khu (อ่าวตาลคู่) is a bay with fine sandy beach popular with local people during holidays. It is 12 kilometres from Laem Ngop or 4 kilometres off Highway No. 3156 (Laem Ngop-Ban Saen Tung). Bungalows and restaurants are available. is located in Tambon Bang Pit. The prominent features of this cove are the fine sandy beach and crystal clear sea. But, it is not suitable for swimming since there are swirling currents. The beach is idyllic for relaxation because of its beauty and nice weather. Restaurants are available on the beach. It is a popular holiday destination for the people of Trat.

Recommended activity : See views of sunset and do beach activities.

To get there : From the town of Trat, take Highway 3156 (Trat-Laem Ngop) for around 16 kilometres and turn right into the lane near the marine police station. Then, drive on for around 3 kilometres to reach the parking lot of the Tan Khu cove.

Amphoe Ko Chang

Mu Ko Chang (หมู่เกาะช้าง) located in the middle of the sea and, thus, having an averagely pleasant climate ideal for vacation. Ko Chang is influenced by monsoons from both the northeast and southwest winds, which bar boat access to the island during May-October. November-May is the most convenient period to travel to Ko Chang and its surrounding islands.

Mu Ko Chang National Park (อุทยานแห่งชาติหมู่เกาะช้าง) with an area of 650 square kilometres, covers more than 52 islands from the territory of Amphoe Laem Ngop, Amphoe Mueang to Amphoe Khlong Yai. The most famous is Ko Chang. In addition, there are other islands with remaining wonderful nature such as Ko Khlum, Ko Lao Ya Nai, Ko Ngam, Ko Mai Si Yai, Ko Wai, Ko Rang, etc. The park office is located in the east of Ko Chang, near Khlong Than Mayom, with a large harbour in its front. There are also 3 National Park Protection Units at Ao Khlong Son, Namtok Khlong Phlu's entrance and Ban Salak Phet, all of which are on Ko Chang.



Ko Chang (เกาะช้าง) previously an unsettled island, is now important as a harbour for ships to escape from the monsoon, and dietary or fresh water resources, especially at Ao Salak Phet or Ao Salat which is well known to pirates, Hai Lam Chinese and Vietnamese. At present, there are 8 villages on the island.

Ko Chang is the second largest island of the country after Phuket, with an area of approximately 429 square kilometres. The topography contains high mountains and complex stone cliffs. The highest mount is *Khao Salak Phet* which is 744 metres high, rich in fertile evergreen forest which is the main water source. Therefore, there are many waterfalls, beaches and splendid reefs in the west of the island.



Ko Chang

Places of Interest in Ko Chang

Ko Chang Naval Battle Site (บริเวณยุทธนาวีเกาะช้าง) located in the southern part of Ko Chang. The Trat waters near Ao Salak Phet and Ao Salak Khok also added another page in the Thai history of fighting for the country's sovereignty. On 17 January 1941, the Royal Thai Navy managed to evict the invaders although we lost a certain number of squadrons and soldiers. 17 January has become a memorial day for the heroic fighting, of which a service is held annually at Ko Chang Naval Battle Memorial in Amphoe Laem Ngop.

Ko Ngam (เกาะง่าม) was the first point of confrontation in the Franco-Siamese War in which the French army sent aircraft on a reconnaissance and bombing of the island, whereas Ko Wai is the point where French patrol aircraft crashed after being fired by HTMS Songkhla and HTMS Chon Buri.

A squadron of 7 French warships led by the Lamotte Piquet Cruiser, 2 sloops and 4 gunboats invaded in 3 divisions. The Lamotte Piquet alone made Division 1 blocking the south of Ko Wai and Ko Bai Tang. Division 2 comprising 1 sloop and 1 gunboat blocked the channel between Ko Khlum and Ko Wai whereas Division 3 comprising 1 sloop and 3 gunboats blocked the channel between Ko Khlum and Laem Bang Bao.

Ko Mai Si (เกาะไม้สั) is a small private island located not far from Ko Kut where there is beautiful nature, sandy beaches and clear water—home to diversified marine life and ideal for diving. Various plant species grow wild on the island, which used to be a confrontation site between the Lamotte Piquet and HTMS Thon Buri that was in commission at Ko Lim. In assisting HTMS Songkhla and HTMS Chon Buri which were heavily fired and eventually sank near Ao Salak Phet and Ao Salak Khok, the HTMS Thon Buri was also hardly attacked, ran aground and sank near Laem Ngop.

Semi-homestay accommodation is available for a group visit of 15-30 persons. A 3 day/2 night package sells at 6,000 Baht, 2-day/1 night at 5,500 Baht. For more details, please contact Tel. 08 9980 5757.

Ao Khlong Son (อ่าวคลองสน) a bay in the northernmost west of the island where Ban Khlong Son Community is located, with a beautiful coral reef. Accommodation is available.

Namtok Khlong Nonsi (น้ำตกคลองนนทรี) a small waterfall to the northeast of the island accessible by a 3 Kilometres pathway from Ban Dan Mai or about 4 Kilometres from the national park's headquarters.

Namtok Than Mayom (น้ำตกธารมะยม) a medium 4 tiered waterfall located some 500 metres through a garden behind the national park's headquarters, with the 3rd tier being the most beautiful. King Rama V, King Rama VII and Queen Rambhai Barni used to visit this waterfall as evident from the royal initials on the rock.

Namtok Khlong Phlu (น้ำตกคลองพลู) a large and most breathtaking waterfall on Ko Chang with water cascading down 3 tiers of the cliff to a basin, with an entrance located 3 Kilometres from Ao Khlong Phrao plus another 20 minute walk.

Hat Sai Yao (หาดทรายยาว) located near Ao Salak Phet to the south of the island with a long stretch of sandy beach where swimming is available. Trekking to the naval battle site, as well as a trip to admire nearby islands such as Ko Lao Ya, Ao Salak Phet, Ko Wai, etc. is provided. Accommodation is available.

Monkey Training Centre (โรงเรียนฝึกลิง) located at Mu 4 Hat Sai Khao, Tambon Ko Chang, the centre provides training as well as shows of monkey's abilities, especially in collecting coconuts. There are 3 shows daily at 10.00 a.m., 02.00 p.m. and 04.00 p.m. Admission is 200 Baht. For more details Tel. 08 1982 8661, 08 6531 3398.

Ban Salak Phet (บ้านสลักเพชร) a large and the oldest community on Ko Chang located in the southern part. The villagers' main occupation is coastal fishery in an advantageous area sheltered from winds and storms by islands and mountains. There is an old temple in front of the village known as Wat Salak Phet built in the reign of King Rama V on his royal visit to the island. Ao Salak Phet is the largest bay on the island.

Namtok Khiri Phet (น้ำตกคีรีเพชร) a single-storeyed waterfall located 3 Kilometres from Ban Salak Phet Community through a rubber plantation.

Namtok Khlong Nueng (น้ำตกคลองหนึ่ง) a small waterfall near Namtok Khiri Phet - Ban Rong Than, located some 2 Kilometres deeper inside the island from the Salak Phet Community with another 480 metre walk. The waterfall cascades down from a narrow gorge for 120 metres. Swimming is available.

Bang Bao Fishery Village (หมู่บ้านประมงบางเบ้า) a village of houses on stilts built into the sea with bridges connecting them together. Most of the villagers are descendants of the Salak Phet villagers, living a simple way of life and earning their living from coastal fishery, with abundant soft cuttlefish and corals. There is a pier, fish dock, and manufacturing of shrimp paste, fish sauce, dried shrimp and salted fish. The area is an ideal berthing area for fishing boats, with mountains and islands providing a good shelter from wind and storms in the monsoon season.



Ban Rong Than (บ้านโรงถ่าน) a small community located near Salak Phet in the southern part of the island. It is a scenic viewpoint where the mist-covered peak of Khao Salak Phet in the north and Ko Maphrao Nai and mountains near Laem Yai in the east are visible. A panoramic view of the whole area of Ao Salak Phet is also available from Samnak Song Atulaphon Banphot on the hill.

Ao Bai Lan (อ่าวไพลาน) located next to Hat Kai Bae and accessible by a pathway across the mountain which takes about 1 hour, with a scenic view of mountains along the way. Ao Bai Lan has a long stretch of serene beach ideal for swimming and relaxing.

Hat Kai Bae (หาดไก่อ้น้ำ) a sloping and long stretch of beach connecting with Hat Khlong Phrao where swimming is

available. There are several bungalows for rent at economy prices, some with mountain bikes available.

Hat Khlong Phrao- Laem Chaiyachet (หาดคลองพร้าว-แหลมไชยเชษฐ์) a long stretch of sloping beach connecting with Hat Kai Bae where swimming is available. There are several bungalows for rent with standard rooms and necessary facilities. The northernmost end of Ao Khlong Phrao connects with Laem Chaiyachet with a scenic rocky cape but swimming is not available.

Admission fees : for adults 500 baht and children 300 baht

Accommodation : contact to the national park offers. For more information, Tel. 0 3955 5084 or contact National Park, Wildlife and Plant Conservation Department, Bangkok, Tel. 0 2562 0760, www.dnp.go.th.

Transportation on the island : from the pier, there is a Song Thaeo minibus to Hat Sai Khao, Hat Khlong Phrao, Hat Kai Bae at 30 Baht. A chartered fare has to be agreed for a journey to other beaches.

Ko Chang Noi and Laem Chang Noi (เกาะช้างน้อย และแหลมช้างน้อย) located in the north of Ko Chang and housing coral reefs between Laem Chang Noi and Ko Chang Noi.

Ko Man Nok-Ko Man Nai (เกาะมันนอก-เกาะมันใน) small islands opposite Hat Kai Bae with surrounding beaches at low tides and golden seaweeds in the nearby shallows.

Ko Khlum (เกาะคลุ้ม) an island ideal for fishing with a peculiar scenery of rocky areas.

Ko Lao Ya (เกาะเหลายา) a group of islands located to the south of Ko Chang comprising Ko Lao Ya Nai, Ko Lao Ya Klang and Ko Lao Ya Nok, approximately 1 hours from Laem Ngop. There are long beaches, clear sea water and beautiful corals, with accommodation available.

Ko Wai (เกาะหวาย) located to the south of Ko Chang near Ko Lao Ya, approximately 2.30 hours from Laem Ngop. It has scenic beaches, as well as large and complete coral reefs ideal for fishing. The bay to the north of the island houses coral reefs in a perfect condition whereas the western area of Ao Yai provides home to mostly hard corals and scaly giant clams. Accommodation is available.

To get there: Boats to Ko Wai depart from Laem Ngop at 03.00 p.m. and arrive at 05.00 p.m., and on the return from the Ko Wai Pakarang Pier at 08.00 p.m. It takes approximately 3 hours and the fare is 130 Baht per person. For more information, please contact Tel. 0 3953 8122.

Ko Phrao Nok or Ko Sai Khao (เกาะพร้าวнок หรือ เกาะทรายขาว) located to the south facing Ao Salak Phet, approximately 2 hours from Laem Ngop Pier. The island has white sandy beaches and shady coconut grove. Accommodation is available.

Ko Ngam (เกาะง่าม) a twin island connected by a large sand bar located to the southeast of Ko Chang, with an inlet surrounded by the hilly topography where the sea is calm and scenic.

To get there : a journey from Laem Ngop takes about 2 hours. Accommodation is available.

Amphoe Ko Kut

Ko Kut (เกาะกูด) Thailand's easternmost island in Trat waters, the province's second largest island next to Ko Chang and the country's fourth largest island. Located 80 Kilometres from Trat, it covers a total area of 105 sq. Kilometres or approximately 65,625 rai, measuring 25 Kilometres long and 12 Kilometres wide. The topography is generally still in its natural condition, with mountains and ridges forming the headwater of many



streams from which originate various waterfalls. The most renowned waterfall on Ko Kut is Namtok Khlong Chao, a 3 tiered waterfall with water all year round running in a stream from the upper tier and cascading down in a large fall into the lower tier ideal for swimming. King Rama VI visited this waterfall in 1911 and named it 'Namtok Anam Kok' in memory of Ong Chiang Sue, an Annamese king who took refuge in the area in the reign of King Rama I.

On the western part of the island, the attractions range from Ao Ta Tin, Hat Khlong Yai Ki, Laem Hin Dam, Hat Khlong Chao, Hat Ngam Kho, Laem Bang Bao, Hat Ao Phrao, as far as Laem Thian. Interesting attractions on the eastern part include Ao Sapparot, Laem Sala, Ao Yai Koet, Ao Khlong Hin, Ao Chak which are all sandy beaches with crystal clear water and serene atmosphere amid a shady coconut grove. The island as well as the nearby Ko Raet and Ko Mai Si are also home to

an intact mangrove forest, beautiful coral reefs and schools of colourful fish.

The native people of Ko Kut are mostly Thai and Khmer immigrants from Ko Kong since the time of French occupation of Patchantakhirikhet in 1904. Ban Khlong Mat is the oldest village on the island whose residents continue to earn their living from agriculture such as rubber plantation, coconut groves and some fruit orchards, as well as coastal fishery. Accommodation is available.

To get there: Tourists can take a passenger boat service at two points : Laem Sok Pier in Tambon Ao Yai, Amphoe Mueang Trat, departing at 11.30 a.m. and returning at 09.30 a.m., Tel. 08 6126 7860; and Bang Bao Pier in Amphoe Ko Chang, Tel. 08 4567 8765. For tourists who purchase a tour package of the resorts on Ko Kut, please contact your resort for further details.

Ko Mak (เกาะหมาก) a large island located in between Ko Chang and Ko Kut, approximately 38 Kilometres from the mainland. It covers a total area of approximately 9,000 rai with the shape of a 4 pointed star. The topography is mostly coastal plain with a thicket of coconut groves and rubber plantations. Scenic bays and sandy beaches embracing crystal clear water are all around the island such as Ao Ta Nit, Ao Prong, Ao Phat and Ao Daeng. Around the shore and the nearby islands, there are beautiful coral reefs. October - May is the ideal period for Visiting. Accommodation is available on the island.

To get there: Tourists can take a passenger boat service at three points : Krommaluang Pier in Amphoe Laem Ngop, Tel. 08 7580 5275, 08 9156 9648, Laem Sok Pier in Tambon Ao Yai, Amphoe Mueang Trat, Tel. 08 6126 7860, and Bang Bao Pier in Amphoe Ko Chang, Tel. 08 4567 8765.

Ko Kradat (เกาะกระดาด) located to the northeast of Ko Mak and covering a total area of approximately 1,200 rai. It has a flat paper-like topography with Alocasia plants 'Kradat' in Thai-growing wild in abundance. Ko Kradat is Thailand's single island with a land title deed issued since the reign of King Rama V when countries in Southeast Asia were being colonised and there were attempts to occupy some areas in Thai territory including Ko Kradat. The island has a long and white sandy beach with beautiful coral reefs. Ko Kradat has been designated among the **Unseen Thailand**

attractions. October - May is an appropriate period for Visiting. Accommodation is available.

To get there : There is no passenger boat service. Tourists are required to buy a tour package of the Ko Kradat Resort, Tel. 08 9202 1661. Otherwise, tourists can take a passenger boat service to Ko Mak at the Krommaluang Pier in Amphoe Laem Ngop, Tel. 08 7580 5275, 08 9156 9648. Then, take a boat service from Ko Mak to Ko Kradat. The fare is about 60 Baht per person (3 passengers or more required).



Ko Kham (เกาะขาม) is an islet near Ko Mak. It takes around 45 minutes by speed boat from Laem Ngop. There are unusual black rocks lying on the front beach with beautiful nature, tranquility, shadiness, clear sea, and clean sand. On the east side, there are beautiful coral reefs where it is best for diving. No tourist accommodation is available on the islet.

To get there : For more information on the boat service to Ko Kham, contact the Krommaluang Pier in Amphoe Laem Ngop at Tel. 08 7580 5275, 08 9156 9648.

Mu Ko Rayang (หมู่เกาะระยั้ง) a group of islands comprising Ko Rayang Nai and Ko Rayang Nok. Ko Rayang Nok is peaceful with white sandy beaches and crystal clear water. Accommodation is available on Ko Rayang Nok.

To get there : For more information on the boat service to Ko Rayang, contact the Krommaluang Pier in Amphoe Laem Ngop at Tel. 08 7580 5275, 08 9156 9648.

Mu Ko Kra (หมู่เกาะกระ) a group of islets to the west of Ko Mak, a swallow bird's nest concession area and a diving spot with beautiful corals.

Mu Ko Rang (หมู่เกาะรัง) a group of islets located approximately 6 Kilometres to the west of Ko Mak. There is not sufficient plains area for human habitation on Ko Rang, which is surrounded by islands of various sizes such as Ko Rang Yai, Ko Rang Lek, Ko Kra, Ko Thian, Ko Thong Luang, Ko Yak, Ko Sam Phi Nong, Ko Mapring, Ko Tun, Ko Kampan, etc. Diving to admire the beautiful corals among schools of fish is available.

To get there : Most of the trips to Ko Rang are aimed at diving only. For more information on the boat service, tourists can contact the Krommaluang Pier in Amphoe Laem Ngop at Tel. 08 7580 5275, 08 9156 9648, and the Bang Bao Pier in Amphoe Ko Chang at Tel. 08 4567 8765.

Ruby (พลอยแดง) Trat has been renowned for its precious red gemstone known as 'Siamese Ruby'. However, as gemstones in the province begin to reduce, the Siamese ruby is now becoming rare.

Ngop Nam Chiao (งอบน้ำเชี่ยว) a folk-style hand-made palm leaf hat identified with the Nam Chiao community. The hat is made into a distinct shape looking like an overturned frying pan or soldier's hat in former times. Ngop Nam Chiao are produced and put on sale at Ban Nam Chiao, Tambon Nam Chiao, Amphoe Laem Ngop.

Rakam Wan (ระกำหวาน) a sweet variety of zalacca which is the most famous fruits out of the province's vast array of fruit produce.

Trat Si Thong Pineapple (สับปะรดตราดสีทอง) a sweet and crispy variety of Trat's juicy pineapple with yellowish skin.

Seafood Products (ผลิตภัณฑ์อาหารทะเล) dried fish and shrimp shrimp paste, processed food, available in markets and at Laem Ngop pier.

Namman Lueang (Yellow Oil) (น้ำมันเหลือง) herbal rubbing oil produced out of folk wisdom since ancient times. The aromatic vapourizing oil helps to relieve muscular pain, stiffness, dizziness, congested nose and cold, available in various brand names.

Thai Ridgeback Dog (สุนัขพันธุ์ไทยหลังอาน) distinctive by its ridged back, smartness and honesty.

Local fighting cock (ไก่ชนพื้นเมือง) is a breed of cock famous for its talent and good tactics in fighting inhabiting Trat.

Community Product Centre (ศูนย์ผลิตภัณฑ์ชุมชน) is located in Amphoe Bo Rai, near the Bo Rai District Office. Agrotourism Attractions

Trat is famous for its array of seasonal fruits such as durian, mangosteen, rambutan, Long Kong, santol and zalacca, which are available right from the orchard, as follows :

Amphoe Mueang

Mangrove Forest Seed Production Center 1 (Trat) (ศูนย์ผลิตเมล็ดพันธุ์ไม้ป่าชายเลน ที่ 1 (ตราด)) located at Mu 2 Tambon Huang Nam Khao, within the mangrove forest on the left bank of the Trat River, covering a total area of 7,500 rai. The center serves as a breeding ground of mangrove plants for reforestation of degraded forests along the inner coast of the Gulf of Thailand. There is a 400 metre long nature trail made into a concrete board walk through the forest. Visitors can study various mangrove plant species as well as birds and animals such as creeping fish and fiddler crab.

Amphoe Khao Saming

Suan Khun Phaithun (สวนคุณไพฑูรย์) is an orchard of fruits for export; such as, durian, rambutan, mangosteen, and longkong.

Ban Suan Saen Rak (บ้านสวนแสนรักษ์) is a fruit orchard based on organic farming and serves as a sufficiency economy learning centre. The fruits grown here are rambutan, mangosteen, and longkong.

Suan Ton Palm (สวนตันปาล์ม) is a fruit orchard based on organic farming with a canal side atmosphere. The fruits available here are mangosteen, rambutan, and longkong.

Suan Si Sot (สวนสี่สด) is a fruit orchard based on organic farming and also offers a homestay service. The fruits grown here are rambutan, mangosteen, and longkong.

Suan Phon Amphai (สวนผลอำไพ) is a fruit orchard that also produces processed fruit. The fruits available here are rambutan, mangosteen, and longkong.

Suan Lang Ban (สวนหลังบ้าน) is an orchard of fruits for export. There is a car ride to see around the orchard and witness how to roast cashew nuts. The fruits grown here are rambutan, mangosteen, and longkong.

(ล่องเรือชมวิถีชีวิตประมงคลองสน) To take a rowing boat to see the way of life of the people of Ban Khlong Tan and study the ecosystems of the mangrove forest, it is 250 Baht/person. To take a rowing boat to see the coastal fishing way of life and the local way of catching water creatures, it is 250 Baht/person. To go diving and see the coral reefs at Ko Mapring and Ko Chang Noi, is 250 Baht/person. To go fishing for fish and squid, it is 1,000-3,000 Baht or 3,000-6,000 Baht, subject to the boat size. Mangrove Forest Tourism Centre (ศูนย์การท่องเที่ยวเชิงธรรมชาติป่าชายเลน) offers a walking tour of the mangrove forest from 08.30 a.m. - 04.30 p.m. To see fireflies, please contact in advance at Tel. 08 9939 7373.

Tambon Huai Raeng Ecotourism Group (ท่องเที่ยวเชิงนิเวศตำบลห้วยแร้ง) Located at Mu 2, Tambon Huai Raeng, the Huai Raeng Community won the "Outstanding Tourism-based Community" award from the Tourism Authority of Thailand in 2007, selected as one of the five example communities of "Best Practices, Lesson Learned and Case Study : Sustainable Community Based Tourism by the Thailand Community Based Tourism Institution (CBT-I) and the Thailand Research Fund (TRF) in 2010, and won the 8th Thailand Tourism Awards : Award of Outstanding Performance for Community-based Tourism Attractions in the Eastern Region. Huai Raeng tourism offers a rustic way of life. The villagers live their life based on the sufficiency theory of His Majesty the King. Tourists will sample "Khao Ho Kap Mak" or rice wrapped in areca palm's spathe, which has been created by the villagers themselves. Natural materials in the local area are adapted as a food container, with no use of foam containing chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) that cause environmental pollution and a problem of disposal. There are community products that are made from nature; such as, mangosteen's rind soap made with a bamboo mould, and Thaowan Khiao juice for health. The Tambon Huai Raeng Ecotourism Community uses tourism as a tool in the development since it is located in an area with many fruit orchards and canals. Tourists will have various means to access nature. There is a habitat of animals, biodiversity, and clean canals that are so clear to see swimming fish. In February, tourists will admire

“Dok Khrut” or Fairy Petticoats flower fully blooming in Khlong Huai Raeng. This white flower looks like a doll’s skirt. A scenic view of nipa palms as high as coconut trees lining the canal sides can be seen. Furthermore, tourists will sample local fruits that have grown together with nature and in perfectly natural surroundings. Travelling to most attractions here is made by boat since the villagers have lived by the canal, which is an important source of their income second to fruit orchards. Almost all of the villagers here do farming, be it rubber plantation, rambutan, mangosteen, or pineapple orchards. However, it is mostly mixed farming.

Recommended activity : See the demonstration of local food cooking with natural materials, Khao Ho Kap Mak and Khanom Chak. See the demonstration of community products; for example, mangosteen’s rind soap, etc., cruise the Huai Raeng Canal to see Dok Khrut, go shrimp fishing, and take a boat trip to see fireflies at night.

To get there : From Bangkok, 9 km before reaching the town of Trat, see the junction to Ban Chang Kluea and turn left. Then, drive on for about 10 Kilometres See the left curve and turn right. After that, see the entrance to Wat Khlong Khut on the left-hand side and turn left to the parking lot in the temple.

Rak Khlong Bang Phra Ecotourism Group (ท่องเที่ยวเชิงนิเวศชุมชนรักษ์คลองบางพระ) is located on Thana Charoen Road, Tambon Bang Phra. The Rak Khlong Bang Phra Community won the award of “Outstanding Tourism Community” from the Tourism Authority of Thailand in 2007. This old trade community of Trat is a marketplace for many groups of merchants because of its location near the mouth of the Trat River, which was the main route of transport in the past. The islanders would make a boat trip to the river’s mouth to deliver coconuts to Ban Bang Phra, whereas the Chinese merchants would come by junk with clothes and chinaware. Moreover, the “Chong” local people of Trat would carry scented wood, forest things, and herbs by the Trat River to sell, and buy necessary things and utensils on their way back to their home in the forest of the Banthat Mountain Range. Nowadays, a hundred old shophouses still stand by the sides of Khlong Bang Phra, and some shops remain in an old-time style; such

as, a Thai traditional medicine shop, which are worth visiting to learn about the façade of Trat in the past. Most of the old houses in the Bang Phra Community have been renovated as restaurants, guesthouses, coffee shops, etc. Because of the charming atmosphere at night, the Community can welcome foreign visitors as well. Presently, tourists travelling here name it “Chiang Khan of the East”.

Recommended activity : Take a boat trip to see fireflies at night, admire the beauty of the ancient houses on Thana Charoen Road, visit the bio-diesel production plant, and tour the “Legend of Khlong Bang Phra Fair” to be held every year during the first week of March, from Friday to Sunday.

To get there: From Bangkok, take Highway 3 (Sukhumvit Road) to pass the town of Trat and the Trat Municipal Market. See the first traffic light intersection (Yaek Lak Mueang) and go straight ahead for about 30 metres. Then, turn left onto Thana Charoen Road and there reach the area of the Rak Khlong Bang Phra Community.

Hat Sai Dam (หาดทรายดำ) is located in the area of Pa Laem Makham which was established as a National Forest Reserve in 1974. This black sandy beach is among the world’s five of its kind, including Hualien-Taitung in Taiwan, Pulau Langkawi in Malaysia, the northern part of California in the US, and Waianapanapa Beach in Hawaii (Maui).

Ban Nam Chiao (บ้านน้ำเขียว) is located at 2/20 Mu 2, Tambon Nam Chiao. The Community won the Outstanding Tourism-based Community Award from TAT in 2007 and the 8th Thailand Tourism Awards (Kinnari) in 2010 : Award of Outstanding Performance for the Community-based Tourism Attraction in the Eastern Region. This two-religion community comprises half of Buddhists and half of Muslims, and boasts an abundance of coastal resources, especially the mangrove forest of Ban Nam Chiao where there is a nature trail to see many interesting things; such as, ecosystems of the mangrove forest, crabs, mudskippers, monkeys, Brahminy kites or red-backed sea eagles, etc. This place is also famous for making “Ngop”, a farmer’s hat made of Chak (nipa palm) leaf, and well-known as “Ngop Nam Chiao”. This is a local handicraft which has been

inherited from the ancient times. Besides, the community has products from fishery; such as, shrimp paste, fish sauce, dried shrimp, etc., to offer to tourists.

Recommended activity: Explore the community of two religions whose members live together in peace, go on the nature trail to study the mangrove forest, climb a bird-watching tower, take a boat trip to see how to catch Hoi Pak Pet, a kind of local food, and go fishing for fish and squid.

To get there : From the town of Trat, follow Highway 3148 (Trat - Laem Ngop) for around 8 Kilometres and see the entrance to the Nam Chiao Sub-district Municipality on the right-hand side near the foot of the bridge across the canal. Tourists can park here.

Diving/Snorkelling

- Do**
- Practise how to use all forms of diving gear.
 - Make sure you are fit, sleep well and take no alcohol.
 - Prepare your diving gear such as diving mask, flippers, snorkel, life vest, scuba, etc.
 - Prepare your wet suit and skin lotion.
 - Wear your life jacket before snorkelling.
 - Tie the boat with the provided buoy.
 - See the corals on the spot designated by your guide only.
 - Be careful not to touch/break the corals.
 - Collect underwater garbage to be discarded on the shore.
- Do not**
- dive when there is insufficient light or at low tide.
 - dive if not being in a healthy physical condition or having personal diseases of the respiratory system and asthma symptoms.
 - leave an unskilled swimmer alone.
 - swim too far from mooring buoys.
 - moor a boat in the coral reefs.
 - get a boat to the coast where there are shallow coral reefs.

- touch the coral.
- throw rubbish on the beach and in the sea.
- kick sand sediments to bury the coral.
- catch or kill sea creatures.
- pick the coral, sea fan, and shells.
- buy souvenirs made of coral, sea fan, etc.

Fishing

- Do***
- Fishing in the appropriate season.
 - Prepare all necessary equipment such as torch, leader, baits, etc.
 - Find yourself a guide (if the fishing spot is unknown to you).
 - Be accompanied when going fishing in case of emergency.

- Do not***
- get fish that are too small.
 - fish in the egg-laying season.
 - fish in the conservation and breeding zones.
 - go fishing alone.
 - fish while there is falling rain and storms.

Swimming in the sea/waterfall

- Do***
- Prepare your medicines, sunglasses, skin lotion, and life saver.
 - Wear light but well-fitting, non-absorbent clothing.
 - Swim near the shore or in the shallows.
 - Be accompanied while swimming in case of emergency.
 - Swim in the morning or late afternoon when it is not too hot.
 - Avoid the jellyfish area.

- Do not***
- swim while there is falling rain/strong wind and waves.
 - throw rubbish in the sea, waterfalls, or on the paths.
 - swim far from the coast in the deep sea.
 - swim alone or at night.
 - pick or take flowers and leaves.
 - climb rocks, boulders, or cliffs at the waterfall.
 - write on rocks and cliffs.

Visiting a temple/museum/ancient monument

- Do***
- Study information about the place to be visited.
 - Dress politely and be composed.
 - Take off your shoes before entering a religious building or area.
 - Not walk off the permitted path.
 - Contact a local speaker such as a monk or officer who can give you information.
 - Avoid touching an artefact or ancient monument.
 - Prepare your tape recorder, notebook or drawing book.
 - Seek permission before taking photos.

- trespass on prohibited zones or walk on ancient monuments.
 - move ancient objects since it may cause them broken.
 - touch ancient buildings, especially their carved designs or paintings.
